

ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS OF BRANTFORD POWER INC.

Brantford Power Inc. has applied to raise its electricity distribution rates and other charges.

Brantford Power Inc. has applied to the Ontario Energy Board to increase the amount it charges by \$4.12 each month for the typical residential customer beginning on January 1, 2017. Other customers, including businesses, may be affected as well.

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD IS HOLDING A COMMUNITY MEETING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) is hosting a meeting on July 14, 2016 at the T.B. Costain/SC Johnson Community Centre, 16 Morrell Street, Brantford, Ontario from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. so that you can:

- Learn more about Brantford Power's costs and rate application
- Find out how the OEB will review the application
- Get involved and provide your comments about the application to the OEB

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD IS ALSO HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING

The OEB will hold a public hearing to consider Brantford Power's request. We will question the company on its case for a rate increase. We will also hear questions and arguments from individuals and from groups that represent Brantford Power customers. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide what, if any, increase will be allowed.

Distributors such as Brantford Power typically apply for a full review of their rates every five years. Any rate changes for the years in between are made by applying a formula that is tied to inflation and other factors intended to promote efficiency. You may not get notice of future rate changes made by applying the formula.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can review Brantford Power's application on the OEB's website now.
- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.
- You can attend the OEB's community meeting (date, time and place set out above) where you can ask questions, make comments and voice your concerns.
- You can become an active participant (called an intervenor). To do so, you must apply for intervenor status by **July 18, 2016**. If your application is not received by this date, you will not get any further notice of the hearing and the hearing may go ahead without you.
- At the end of the process, you can review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website.

These proposed charges relate to Brantford Power's distribution services. They make up part of the Delivery line – one of the five line items on your bill. ORAL VS. WRITTEN HEARINGS

There are two types of OEB hearings – oral and written. Brantford Power has applied for a written hearing. The OEB is considering this request. If you think an oral hearing is needed, you can write to the OEB to explain why by **July 18, 2016**.

PRIVACY

If you write a letter of comment, your name and the content of your letter or the documents you file with the OEB will be put on the public record and the OEB website. However, your personal telephone number, home address and email address will be removed. If you are a business, all your information will remain public. If you apply to become an intervenor, all information will be public.

This rate hearing will be held under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998 c.15 (Schedule B).
