This letter is for filing an objection to proposed electricity cost increases by Ontario Power Generation Inc. [OPG]

I am opposed to any increased rates or costs by OPG.

OPG should recoup future proposed increases by reducing the salaries and benefits of their Executives and employees and use that money to fund the proposed increase.

If one looks at Ontario's "Sunshine List" we can see that in 2015 a total of 7,633 OPG employees earned an average salary of \$140,660 with an average salary increase of 4.0% with a total payroll of about \$1.7 billion.
