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1 INTRODUCTION AND SUMMARY

This is a rate order of the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) on an application filed by Milton Hydro Distribution Inc. (Milton Hydro) to change its electricity distribution rates in 2016.

On July 28, 2016, the OEB issued a Decision and Order (Decision) in which it determined the final parameters that should be used to calculate Milton Hydro's rates to be effective May 1, 2016. In its Decision, the OEB approved a partial settlement proposal between Milton Hydro, the School Energy Coalition (SEC), Energy Probe (EP) and the Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition (VECC). In addition, the Decision addressed the two issues that were not covered by the settlement proposal:

- (i) Whether Milton Hydro's budgeted 2016 Operation, Maintenance and Administration (OM&A) expenses are appropriate (OM&A Expenses Issue); and
- (ii) Whether recovery in rates of all of the 2016 revenue requirement related to the land and building at 200 Chisholm Drive is appropriate (200 Chisholm Drive Issue).

Milton Hydro filed a draft rate order implementing the Decision. OEB staff and other parties were given an opportunity to make comments on the draft rate order. In response to those comments, Milton Hydro revised its draft rate order.

The OEB has reviewed Milton Hydro's revised draft rate order and is satisfied that it accurately reflects the Decision.

Although Milton Hydro filed a motion to review and vary the Decision on August 17, 2016, the OEB has determined that it will issue a final rate order for reasons set out below.

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¹ On April 29, 2016, the OEB issued an interim rate order declaring Milton Hydro's current approved distribution rates interim as of May 1, 2016 and until such time as the OEB issues a final rate order.

2 THE PROCESS

In the Decision, Milton Hydro was ordered to file a draft rate order by August 9, 2016.

On August 9, 2016, Milton Hydro wrote to the OEB to advise that it did not intend to file a draft rate order, because it planned to bring a motion to review and vary the Decision.

On August 9, 2016, SEC wrote to the OEB opposing Milton Hydro's intent to not file a draft rate order and suggesting that, given the small impact on rates resulting from the Decision, there does not appear to be any prejudice to Milton Hydro or the ratepayers in proceeding with the rate adjustment at this time. SEC also submitted that, if there is a slightly larger increase as a result of the motion to review, it will be easier for everyone if the adjustments are sequential, rather than one large adjustment at some later date.

On August 10, 2016, the OEB issued a letter indicating that it expected Milton Hydro to file a draft rate order while extending the deadline for doing so by three days to August 12, 2016. The deadline for OEB staff and intervenors to comment on the draft rate order was extended to August 18, 2016, and the deadline for Milton Hydro to respond to any comments was extended to August 22, 2016.

On August 12, 2016, Milton Hydro filed a draft rate order implementing the OEB's Decision. The draft rate order included detailed supporting information showing the calculation of final rates. OEB staff and EP filed comments.

As a result of the comments filed by OEB staff and EP, Milton Hydro filed a revised draft rate order on August 22, 2016.

3 MILTON HYDRO'S REQUEST TO DELAY THE FINAL RATE ORDER

In its August 12, 2016 submission on the draft rate order, Milton Hydro requests that the OEB refrain from issuing a final rate order at this time. It relies on its intent to file a motion for review of certain portions of the July 28, 2016 Decision (this motion was filed on August 17, 2016) and a contention that a second rate adjustment for 2016 (which may occur if the motion is successful) may lead to confusion for Milton Hydro's customers.

The facts presented by Milton Hydro in its notice of motion reveal that the potential revenue requirement increase for 2016, if the variance relief that it seeks is granted, is small. The potential for more significant revenue requirement increases occurs in years beyond 2016. Moreover, Milton Hydro should be able to explain to its customers the circumstances leading to any subsequent changes to its 2016 rates, if necessary.

In these circumstances, the OEB finds issuance of a final 2016 rate order now is unlikely to cause customer confusion and that the issuance of such an order should not be delayed.

Milton Hydro will not be prejudiced by the issuance of a final 2016 rate order at this time. The OEB panel assigned to consider the motion for review will be fully empowered to grant any variance relief related to the 2016 rates that might be necessary to keep Milton Hydro whole for 2016. The rate impact for the years 2017 and beyond of any variance to the July 28, 2016 Decision that the OEB might make in response to the motion for review will be determined when Milton Hydro applies for rates for each of those years.

4 RATE ORDER

The OEB has reviewed Milton Hydro's revised draft rate order, including the proposed Tariff of Rates and Charges, and is satisfied that it accurately reflects the Decision. The approved Tariff of Rates and Charges is attached as Schedule A.

This rate order establishes Milton Hydro's distribution rates effective May 1, 2016, but implemented on September 1, 2016.

As a result of this rate order, the total bill impact for a typical residential customer with an average monthly consumption of 750 kWh is estimated to decrease by 0.5% or \$0.65 on a monthly bill.

5 ORDER

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The Tariff of Rates and Charges set out in Schedule A of this Rate Order is final effective May 1, 2016.
- The Tariff of Rates and Charges will apply to electricity consumed or estimated to have been consumed on and after September 1, 2016. Milton Hydro shall notify its customers of the rate changes no later than the delivery of the first bill reflecting the new rates.
- 3. SEC, VECC and EP shall submit their cost claims no later than September 1, 2016.
- 4. Milton Hydro shall file with the OEB and forward to SEC, VECC and EP any objections to the claimed costs no later than September 12, 2016.
- 5. SEC, VECC and EP shall file with the OEB and forward to Milton Hydro any responses to any objections for cost claims no later than September 19, 2016.
- 6. Milton Hydro shall pay the OEB's costs incidental to this proceeding upon receipt of the OEB's invoice.

RESIDENTIAL SERVICE CLASSIFICATION

This classification refers to the supply of electrical energy to detached, semi-detached and townhouse residential buildings as defined in local zoning bylaws. A residential service is a single-family unit used for domestic or household purposes, including seasonal occupancy. At Milton Hydro's discretion, residential rates may be applied to apartment buildings with 6 or less units by simple application of the residential rate by blocking the residential rate by the number of units. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

Where the residential dwelling comprises the entire electrical load of a farm, it is defined as a residential service. Where the residential dwelling does not comprise the entire electrical load of the farm:

- The service will be defined as a General Service if the occupant derives his/her principal livelihood from the working of the farm:
- The service will be defined as a Residential Service if the occupant does not derive his/her principal livelihood from the working of the farm;
- Where the residential farm dwelling is supplied by one separately metered service and the electrical loads in other buildings are supplied by a different separately metered service, then the former is defined as a Residential Service and the latter is defined as a General Service.

APPLICATION

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, or as specified herein.

Unless specifically noted, this schedule does not contain any charges for the electricity commodity, be it under the Regulated Price Plan, a contract with a retailer or the wholesale market price, as applicable. In addition, the charges in the MONTHLY RATES AND CHARGES – Regulatory Component of this schedule do not apply to a customer that is an embedded wholesale market participant.

It should be noted that this schedule does not list any charges, assessments or credits that are required by law to be invoiced by a distributor and that are not subject to Board approval, such as the Debt Retirement Charge, the Global Adjustment, the Ontario Clean Energy Benefit and the HST.

ONTARIO ELECTRICITY SUPPORT PROGRAM RECIPIENTS

In addition to the charges specified on page 1 of this tariff of rates and charges, the following credits are to be applied to eligible residential customers.

APPLICATION

The application of the charges are in accordance with the Distribution System Code (Section 9) and subsection 79.2(4) of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998.

The application of these charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

In this class:

"Aboriginal person" includes a person who is a First Nations person, a Métis person or an Inuit person;

"account-holder" means a consumer who has an account with a distributor that falls within a residential-rate classification as specified in a rate order made by the Ontario Energy Board under section 78 of the Act, and who lives at the service address to which the account relates for at least six months in a year;

"electricity-intensive medical device" means an oxygen concentrator, a mechanical ventilator, or such other device as may be specified by the Ontario Energy Board;

"household" means the account-holder and any other people living at the accountholder's service address for at least six months in a year, including people other than the account-holder's spouse, children or other relatives;

"household income" means the combined annual after-tax income of all members of a household aged 16 or over;

MONTHLY RATES AND CHARGES

Class A

- (a) account-holders with a household income of \$28,000 or less living in a household of one or two persons;
- (b) account-holders with a household income of between \$28,001 and \$39,000 living in a household of three persons;
- (c) account-holders with a household income of between \$39,001 and \$48,000 living in a household of five persons; and
- (d) account-holders with a household income of between \$48,001 and \$52,000 living in a household of seven or more persons; but does not include account-holders in Class E.

OESP Credit \$ (30.00)

Class B

- (a) account-holders with a household income of \$28,000 or less living in a household of three persons;
- (b) account-holders with a household income of between \$28,001 and \$39,000 living in a household of four persons;
- (c) account-holders with a household income of between \$39,001 and \$48,000 living in a household of six persons;

but does not include account-holders in Class F.

OESP Credit \$ (34.00)

Class C

- (a) account-holders with a household income of \$28,000 or less living in a household of four persons;
- (b) account-holders with a household income of between \$28,001 and \$39,000 living in a household of five persons;
- (c) account-holders with a household income of between \$39,001 and \$48,000 living in a household of seven or more persons;

but does not include account-holders in Class G.

OESP Credit \$ (38.00)

Class D

- (a) account-holders with a household income of \$28,000 or less living in a household of five persons; and
- (b) account-holders with a household income of between \$28,001 and \$39,000 living in a household of six persons;

but does not include account-holders in Class H.

- (c) the account-holder or any member of the account-holder's household regularly uses, for medical purposes, an electricity-intensive medical device at the dwelling to which the account relates.

Class H

Class H comprises account-holders with a household income and household size described under Class D who also meet any of the following conditions:

- (a) the dwelling to which the account relates is heated primarily by electricity;
- (b) the account-holder or any member of the account-holder's household is an Aboriginal person; or
- (c) the account-holder or any member of the account-holder's household regularly uses, for medical purposes, an electricity-intensive medical device at the dwelling to which the account relates.

- (c) the account-holder or any member of the account-holder's household regularly uses, for medical purposes, an electricity-intensive medical device at the dwelling to which the account relates.
