Re: EB-2016-<u>0061 - CNPI 2017 Rates</u>

We are counsel for the School Energy Coalition. This letter is being sent at the request of our clients to support the idea that the oral hearing in this matter be held in the major population centre served by CNPI, Fort Erie and Port Colborne.

The parties have consented to SEC advising the Board that many of the major issues in this proceeding have not settled, and so must be adjudicated after an oral hearing. The parties expect to file a partial settlement agreement, dealing with many minor issues, in due course.

In the meantime, the Board announced in May that it would consider holding hearings on rate proposals in the local areas that are affected. In this particular case, the Board will be aware that at the Community Day in Niagara there were a large number of concerned citizens (as there were in Gananoque). This is a manageable proceeding, in which the oral hearing is not likely to be more than two days, and perhaps can be completed in one day. The combination of strong local concern, and a relatively short oral hearing, may make this case a good opportunity to pilot the plan for local electricity distribution rate hearings.

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SEC is therefore writing this letter to indicate to the Board that SEC, as well as intervenors Energy Probe and VECC, all support having the CNPI oral hearing in the Niagara Region. We also recommend that arrangements be made to ensure that live streaming is still available in Gananoque, the other area served.
