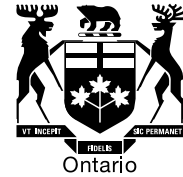

Thank you for your e-mail of January 18, 2017. Your e-mail was received prior to the deadline printed in the notice published in local newspapers on January 11 and January 13, 2017.

In your e-mail, you have asked to be an intervenor in the case. The OEB is currently considering your request.

As required by the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, the Ontario Energy Board OEB (OEB) can only consider three issues in making its decision:

- The interests of consumers with respect to prices and the reliability and quality of electricity service
- The promotion of the use of renewable energy sources in a manner consistent with the policies of the Government of Ontario
- The form of agreement that Henvey Inlet Wind LP offers to landowners

Intervenors are active participants in the hearing. They receive all of the evidence in the case, all OEB-issued documents, may provide evidence of their own, ask written or verbal questions related to the applicant's evidence (called interrogatories or cross-examination) and argue their positions to the OEB members who will be deciding whether or not to approve the application.

As indicated in the OEB's notice, this case will be decided through a public hearing. The date, time and location of that hearing have not yet been set by the OEB.

You will soon receive a decision from the OEB regarding whether you have been granted intervenor status in this case, and whether you are granted intervenor status or not, you will receive a copy of the OEB's final decision in this case when it is released.
