Natural Resource Gas Limited

Application for approval to sell natural gas distribution system

PROCEDURAL ORDER NO. 1 March 29, 2017

Natural Resource Gas Limited (Natural Resource Gas) filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) on December 1, 2016 under section 43(1)(a) of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, *1998*, S.O. 1998, c. 15, (Schedule B), seeking approval to sell its natural gas distribution system to EPCOR Natural Gas Limited Partnership (EPCOR Natural Gas). The application was amended on January 25, 2017.

A Notice of Hearing was issued on February 23, 2017. Each of Union Gas Limited (Union Gas), the Integrated Grain Processors Co-operative Inc. (IGPC), EPCOR Natural Gas, and the Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition (VECC) applied for intervenor status. VECC also applied for cost eligibility. No objection was received from Natural Resource Gas.

Union Gas, IGPC, EPCOR Natural Gas, and VECC are approved as intervenors. The list of parties in this proceeding is attached as Schedule A to this Procedural Order. I have also determined that VECC is eligible to apply for an award of costs under the OEB's *Practice Direction on Cost Awards*.

Cost eligible intervenors should be aware that the OEB will not generally allow the recovery of costs for the attendance of more than one representative of any party, unless a compelling reason is provided when cost claims are filed.

The OEB will determine later in the process whether an oral hearing is required in this case.

Confidentiality Requests

In accordance with the OEB's *Practice Direction on Confidential Filings* and pursuant to Rule 10 of the OEB's *Rules of Practice and Procedure*, Natural Resource Gas requests confidentiality for certain portions of the Asset Purchase Agreement (APA), filed as part of the application. Natural Resource Gas states that it has redacted information to protect "personal information" within the meaning of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* as well as information that is considered by Natural Resource Gas and EPCOR Natural Gas to be commercially sensitive.

Natural Resource Gas filed a non-confidential redacted version of the APA and a cover letter setting out its reasons for the confidentiality requests. Natural Resource Gas also filed two confidential unredacted versions of the APA - one reflecting the commercially sensitive information and another fully unredacted version, reflecting both the commercially sensitive information and the personal information.

As an interim measure, the OEB will allow any parties that wish to review the confidential information that Natural Resource Gas says is commercially sensitive to do so after signing a copy of the OEB's Declaration and Undertaking, and filing it with the OEB. The OEB will not allow any parties to review the identified personal information filed in confidence until the OEB has determined whether the disclosure of the personal information is permitted under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.

The *Practice Direction on Confidential Filings* permits any party to a proceeding to object to the requests for confidentiality by filing a written objection. This Procedural Order addresses the process for receiving such objections. Subsequent to any and all submissions received pursuant to this Procedural Order, the OEB will make its findings with respect to Natural Resource Gas' claims for confidentiality.

Interrogatories

At this time, provision is being made for written interrogatories.

Parties should not engage in exploration of items that are not relevant to the OEB's review of a consolidation application. While the OEB recognizes that there are no specific filing requirements for natural gas utility consolidation applications, in developing interrogatories, parties should be guided by the Handbook to Electricity Distributor and Transmitter Consolidations for what the OEB generally considers in its review.

In making its decision on cost awards, the OEB will consider whether intervenors made reasonable efforts to ensure that their participation in the hearing was focused on material issues.

Parties should consult sections 26 and 27 of the OEB's *Rules of Practice and Procedure* regarding required naming and numbering conventions and other matters related to interrogatories.

It is necessary to make provision for the following matters related to this proceeding.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

- OEB staff and intervenors may make written submissions concerning Natural Resource Gas' confidentiality requests. Any such submissions must be filed with the OEB and delivered to Natural Resource Gas and all intervenors by April 10, 2017.
- 2. Natural Resource Gas shall file with the OEB and deliver to all intervenors any reply submissions relating to the confidentiality requests by **April 20, 2017**.
- 3. OEB staff and intervenors shall request any relevant information and documentation from Natural Resource Gas that is in addition to the evidence already filed, by written interrogatories filed with the OEB and served on all parties by **April 25, 2017**.
- 4. Natural Resource Gas shall file with the OEB complete written responses to all interrogatories and serve them on all intervenors and OEB staff by **May 16, 2017**.

All filings to the OEB must quote the file number, EB-2016-0351, be made in searchable/ unrestricted PDF format electronically through the OEB's web portal at https://www.pes.ontarioenergyboard.ca/eservice/. Two paper copies must also be filed at the OEB's address provided below. Filings must clearly state the sender's name, postal address and telephone number, fax number and e-mail address. Parties must use the document naming conventions and document submission standards outlined in the RESS Document Guideline found at

<u>http://www.ontarioenergyboard.ca/OEB/Industry</u>. If the web portal is not available parties may email their documents to the address below. Those who do not have internet access are required to submit all filings on a CD in PDF format, along with two

paper copies. Those who do not have computer access are required to file 7 paper copies.

All communications should be directed to the attention of the Board Secretary at the address below, and be received no later than 4:45 p.m. on the required date.
