The Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO) has applied to the Ontario Energy Board to raise its domestic usage fee to \$1.2187/MWh effective January 1, 2017, a 4.7% increase from the previously approved usage fee. If the application is approved, a typical residential customer in Ontario will see an increase of \$0.04 per month in the IESO fee which is included in the Regulatory Charges line of your electricity bill. For export customers, the IESO is requesting a usage fee of \$0.9872 per MWh effective January 1, 2017, a 2.8% increase from the previously approved usage fee.

The IESO is also seeking the following approvals:

- a 2017 gross revenue requirement (excluding forecast revenue) of \$191.4 million, which includes capital
 expenditures of \$25 million and \$12 million of funding for the Market Renewal project
- to retain \$10 million as an operating reserve, and to rebate \$12.5 million to market participants
- to continue to charge registration fees, a non-refundable application fee for the Feed-in Tariff program and a market participation application fee at the current rates

It is important to review the application carefully to determine whether you may be affected by these and other approvals that the IESO is seeking.

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider the IESO's requests. We will consider the evidence filed by the IESO, question the IESO on its proposals, and allow interested individuals and groups that wish to participate to provide evidence, question the company and make arguments about whether the requests should be granted. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will determine if the IESO's proposed revenue requirement, expenditures and fees are appropriate and whether the approvals sought should be granted.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

Conservation

Whole Home Pilot Program launch

The Whole Home Pilot Program is now available for residential customers. Information on participation is available on the <u>Save on Energy</u>, <u>Union Gas</u> and <u>Enbridge Gas</u> websites. The program will be delivered to customers by the gas utilities and their energy service providers.

The pilot is designed to improve customer convenience by establishing a one-window, one service provider multi-fuel energy efficiency program. Customers are offered incentives for retrofits/equipment upgrades through participating in home energy audits.

The program is expected to include approximately 22,000 households by the end of 2017 and the electricity savings portion are funded by the Conservation First Framework (CFF).

Market and System Operations

Draft Regulation Service RFP documents available for comment

Regulation service plays an important role in ensuring reliable systems operations. It acts to match total system generation to total system demand on a minute by minute or second-by second basis as required on the electricity grid, and helps correct variations in power system frequency.

A draft version of the 2017 Request for Proposals for Incremental Regulation Capacity ("Regulation Service RFP") is available on the <u>Regulation Service RFP</u> webpage for comment and feedback. These draft documents incorporate feedback received through formal Requests for Information that occurred in September and December 2016. Comments and feedback on the draft documents are invited until Friday June 16, 2017. Submissions can be made by email to <u>RegulationRFP@ieso.ca</u>

Transmission Rights Clearing Account Disbursement

Participants withdrawing energy from the IESO-administered market will see a payment from the Transmission Rights Clearing Account disbursement on the May 31 preliminary settlement statement and May 2017 invoice, both issued on June 14. Funds from the clearing account will be credited using charge type 102 'TR Clearing Account Credit.'

The total amount of this disbursement will be \$76 million. Market participants will receive their pro-rata share of the total amount based on the total allocated quantity of energy withdrawn (AQEW) for consumers, or the scheduled quantity of energy withdrawn (SQEW) for exporters, over the last six months (December 2016 – May 2017).

Through the <u>transmission rights market</u> in Ontario the IESO sells transmission rights through an auction process entitling the owner to a payment if the price of energy in Ontario is different from the price in an intertie zone. The Transmission Rights Clearing Account has a threshold set by the IESO Board and surplus amounts in the account are disbursed over time.

Preliminary Release Plan for changes to IESO IT systems posted for review

The plan is posted for review under Release R38.0 on the IT Release Schedule.

This plan contains a number of enhancements for users of the Outage Coordination and Scheduling System (OCSS).

In addition, the Market Information Management (MIM) IDK will no longer be available after September 13, 2017. Last summer, when the MIM refresh was completed, a 12-month transition period began for participants to move all APIs from the IDK to the Web Service. The IDK will now be removed from service.
