The delivery charge already equals or surpasses the cost of the electricity delivered. This is unacceptable. There is no other industry where delivery costs as much or more than the product. I have noticed that whenever a new solar farm installation occurs, Hydro One is on site installing new and bigger hydro poles and lines. It makes me wonder whether these high delivery charges are the result of Hydro One subsidizing businesses establishing solar farms. I would need to see evidence that this is not the case before I would ever agree to further increases in delivery costs.
