Ontario consumers are paying the highest hydro rates in Canada. That said the delivery rate portion of our hydro bills is disproportionate to the amount of electricity we are using. I understand that the lines and equipment must be maintained. However, when the amount of the delivery charge is over 100% of the amount of electricity consumed it is excessive.
