Unfortunately, BOMA neglected to file a letter indicating its preference for either a written or oral hearing in a timely manner. BOMA apologizes for the lateness of its comments. BOMA did submit a letter proposing an oral hearing (Attachment 1 to this letter) at an earlier stage of the proceeding, which cited the MRP and the proposed scorecard as issues that would benefit for such a hearing.

BOMA is of the view that an oral hearing should be held on both issues 4.4 and 5.1. With respect to the appropriateness of the regulatory scorecard, as noted by Environmental Defence and others, there are a number of factual issues that need to be clarified through cross-examinations.

On the need for a Market Renewal Program Deferral Account, the degree to which the deferral account would enhance oversight, including prudency review, needs to be clarified.

Re: IESO, 2017 Expenditure and Revenue Requirement Submission

Board File No. EB-2017-0150

BOMA recommends that the EB-2017-0150 proceed by way of an oral hearing.

First, the IESO is requesting substantial incremental funding to support its proposed market renewal program, a major new initiative which needs the scrutiny possible only in an oral hearing.

Second, there are important issues related to commitments the IESO made in EB-2015-0275, including the appropriateness of the IESO's regulatory scorecard (particularly in light of past questions over the IESO's performance metrics), the costs related to IESO's implementing the Ontario GHG Cap and Trade initiative, and CDM, especially given the importance of CDM to a successful Cap and Trade Program, and IESO's new responsibilities for transmission procurement and providing technical reports with respect to the Long-Term Energy Plan, and the IESO's rationale as to why it cannot benchmark its activities relative to other similar Canadian and US agencies. These are all important, potentially contentious issues, which would benefit from exposure in an oral hearing.
