EB-2017-0182 - Upper Canada Transmission Inc. - Application for Leave to Construct a Transmission Line - Hydro One Networks Inc. Intervenor Status Request

Hydro One Networks Inc. has received your letter dated November 2, 2017, concerning the above-noted matter.

Hydro One confirms that on September 22, 2017, it filed a letter using the OEB's electronic filing system, RESS, stating that Hydro One is prepared to submit an alternative s. 92 application to construct the East-West Tie Line. Hydro One intended this letter to form part of the public record of the case.

Regarding your request that Hydro One "clarify the nature of its interest, as well as the nature and scope of its proposed participation, in Upper Canada Transmission Inc.'s ("UCT") application," Hydro One's position has not changed. Hydro One's stated interest, and the purpose and nature of its intervention, in EB-2017-0182, are still the same.

More specifically, Hydro One expects that its participation in the UTC application will provide information concerning the proposed UCT routing and possible changes in routing, the UCT construction timetable and in-service date, and the progress of UCT's various consultations and environmental approvals. All of those items are relevant to Hydro One's own s. 92 application for transformer station work necessary for the EWT line.

As a result of participating in the UCT application, Hydro One as well as other intervenors will receive information that will be considered for Hydro One's own intended s. 92 application for leave to construct the line.
