- Re: Regulation of Unit Sub-Meter Providers: OEB File No.: EB-2017-0371

On October 26, 2017, the Ontario Ministry of Energy announced in the 2017 Long-Term Energy Plan (LTEP) that planned to enhance consumer protection by giving the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) increased regulatory authority over Unit Sub-Meter Providers (USMPs). The LTEP explained that increased OEB oversight will ensure that consumers served by USMPs can benefit from:

- Clarity about what goes into the prices they are charged;
- Practices regarding disconnections; and,
- Access to the OEB's processes to resolve issues regarding the quality of service USMPs provide to their customers.

Amendments to section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* came into force on April 1, 2018. These amendments prohibit a USMP from charging for unit sub-metering except in accordance with an order of the OEB. On March 15, 2018, the OEB issued an Interim Order authorizing USMPs to continue charging their customers per their contracts for sub-metering services until the OEB has completed the consultation and approved charges for USMPs.

The OEB has begun a consultation to establish the OEB's method(s) for regulating USMPs charges (EB-2017-0371). In order to ensure it heard from customers of USMPs the OEB launched a survey in March 2018 to gather input from individual unit submetered customers.

As part of its work on this initiative, the OEB is inviting selected stakeholders to meetings with OEB staff. The aim of these meetings will be to learn about stakeholders' experiences with USMPs, services provided and the fees they charge. As well, OEB staff will be interested in any initial insight regarding the appropriate process to set USMP charges in a manner that protects the interests of consumers while also providing for a viable USMP industry.

## Stakeholder Meetings

OEB staff will hold 1 day meetings with each of the groups mentioned below. These meetings will be held **the week of April 16, 2018.**
