EB-2017-0183: Review of Customer Service Rules

Cost Claim of the Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition (VECC)

Please find attached the cost claim of the Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition (VECC).

The number of hours claimed by VECC exceeds the 8 hours allowed by the Board for preparation, attendance at, and reporting on the stakeholder meeting.

Jennifer Chow, the articling student working with me on VECC's energy matters, represented VECC in this consultation. I asked Ms. Chow to undertake all the steps that I felt were necessary in order to represent the interests of vulnerable consumers in an informed and professional manner. My specific instructions to Ms. Chow were to:

- 1. Consult with VECC's member organizations and expert analysts to gather their input;
- 2. Review previous arguments VECC has made regarding customer service rules, for example, as raised in InnPower EB-2016-0085;
- 3. Review the record to date, the OEB's survey results, the report of the Hydro One Ombudsman, and the prior report of the Ontario Ombudsman on Hydro One; and
- 4. Collect evidence regarding customer service rules and practices for other monthly billed services and for electricity/gas in other jurisdictions.

This preparatory work was necessary for VECC to participate in a meaningful and responsible manner. The amount of VECC's cost claim (\$1,748.85) is still modest and less than what would have been incurred if VECC had relied on its expert analysts. VECC's claim also excludes time spent by VECC's analysts providing input to Ms. Chow and time spent by a student volunteer who assisted with Ms. Chow's research.

As a result, VECC requests that its cost claim be allowed in full, notwithstanding that the number of hours spent on this file exceeds the time allowed by the Board.
