Please accept this letter as application for Intervenor Status pursuant to Rule 22.05 of the Ontario Energy Board's *Rules of Practice and Procedure* by Batchewana First Nation.

About Batchewana First Nation

Batchewana First Nation is an Indian Band pursuant to the *Indian Act* and party to the *Robinson-Huron Treaty* of 1850. The Treaty description of lands set aside for Batchewana First Nation's use is as follows:

FIFTEENTH – For Nebenaigoching and his Band, a tract of land extending from Wanabekineyunnung west of Gros Cap to the boundary of the lands ceded by the Chiefs of Lake Superior, and inland ten miles throughout the whole distance, including Batchewanaung Bay; and also the small island at Sault Ste. Marie used by them as a fishing station.

Batchewana First Nation maintains a commercial fishery that uses the waters of Lake Superior from Whitefish Island and stretching all along the shoreline of Lake Superior to the boundary of Pukaskwa National Park. The inherent right to fish, hunt and make use of the lands throughout our Original Reserve remains a part of the way of life for Batchewana First Nation.

These rights also trigger the Crown's Duty to Consult and the expectation that the Batchewana First Nation will have full participation in the development of projects that can impact those rights and interests.

Batchewana's Intended Participation

Batchewana First Nation intends to participate to address several key issues raised in the Ontario Energy Board's notice including:

- 1. Can NextBridge's environmental assessment work for the East-West Tie line project be used by Hydro One for the purpose of complying with *Environmental Assessment Act* requirements?
- 2. What are the implications for Hydro One's proposed project if no exemption is forthcoming or it cannot avail itself of the environmental assessment work performed by Nextbridge?
- 3 What indigenous consultation obligations arise from Hydro One's proposal to build the Lake Superior Link, and specifically, from the proposed reinforcement of transmission towers in Pukwaskwa National Park? How will such obligations be satisfied within the proposed project timelines?

In our proposed written submission, Batchewana First Nation will provide additional information about the Original Reserve and the history of the Batchewana First Nation including our assertion with respect to the Original Reserve and we will also address the relationship between Batchewana First Nation and Nextbridge Infrastructure and the ongoing work that is contemplated by those Parties.

Failure to Consult

Batchewana First Nation wishes to remind the Ontario Energy Board that there has been a failure to consult on the part of Hydro One Inc. on the Lake Superior Link. Information provided to Batchewana First Nation to date has only dealt with proposed work by Hydro One Inc. at the Wawa Transmission facility and in that regard, there has been no direct contact /communications between Hydro One Inc. and Batchewana First Nation.

Batchewana First Nation would also like to address Hydro One Inc.'s claim that consultation with indigenous groups can be completed within 45 days.

Letter of Support

Batchewana First Nation Chief and Council has been engaged with Nextbridge Infrastructure on their project as currently before the Ontario Energy Board under files EB-2011-0140 and EB-2015-0216. Attached you will find a letter of support for this project and the current proponent.
