Union Gas Limited has applied to the Ontario Energy Board for an order granting Union Gas Limited a certificate of public convenience and necessity to construct works to supply natural gas in the unincorporated Township of Poitras.

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD IS HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider Union Gas' requests. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide whether to grant Union Gas' requests.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

CERTIFICATES OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY

In order to distribute natural gas in Ontario, a person must comply with the requirements of the *Municipal Franchises Act*. This Act requires that a person that intends to distribute natural gas within a municipality must first receive approval from the OEB, in the form of a certificate of public convenience and necessity. Where the OEB has issued a certificate for an area but there is currently no natural gas distribution service, another person can apply for a certificate to serve that area. The OEB also regulates the distribution of natural gas within unincorporated townships and unorganized areas in the same manner.

With respect to the unincorporated Township of Poitras, facilities providing natural gas service to end users were put in place prior to Union Gas requesting and receiving approval from the OEB in the form of a certificate. This application addresses this situation.

BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can review the application filed by Union Gas on the OEB's website now.
- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.
- You can become an active participant (called an intervenor). Apply by July 3, 2018 or the hearing will go ahead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding.
- At the end of the process, you can review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website.

The OEB does not intend to provide for an award of costs for this hearing.

ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD

IN THE MATTER OF the *Municipal Franchises Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c.M.55, as amended;

AND IN THE MATTER OF an Application by Union Gas Limited for an Order approving a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct works to supply natural gas in the unincorporated Township of Poitras.

APPLICATION (Updated)

- Union Gas Limited ("Union"), a regulated public utility, is a corporation incorporated under the laws of the Province of Ontario, with its head office at the Municipality of Chatham-Kent, in the Province of Ontario.
- 2. On August 19, 2016, Union was directed by the Ontario Energy Board to file a report by December 31, 2016 confirming that Union has obtained Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity covering the geographic areas in which its facilities are located. If during its investigation facilities are found to be located in areas where it does not hold Certificate rights, Union is to advise the Board as to where the infrastructure is located and to provide a plan to rectify the situation.
- 3. During its investigation of Certificates, Union has identified 70 customers being served within the unincorporated community of Thorne which is within the unincorporated Township of Poitras in the Nipissing District of Northeastern Ontario. Thorne is located at the northernmost end of Highway 63, just across the Ottawa River from Temiscaming, Québec and approximately 63 km northeast of North Bay.
- 4. In June 1979, TransCanada Pipelines applied to the National Energy Board for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct a 39.5 kilometre transmission pipeline (the Temiscaming Extension) commencing at the North Bay Compressor Station to a proposed meter station in the unincorporated Township of Poitras, in the vicinity of Thorne.
- 5. The additional facilities TransCanada planned to build would enable Northern and Central Gas to serve Thorne and allow Northern and Central Gas' subsidiary Le Gaz to serve Temiscaming. In its application, TransCanada noted that Northern and Central Gas would be applying for regulatory approvals to serve Thorne. In both its application and a sales contract with Northern and Central Gas, TransCanada stated that it had also agreed to sell gas to Northern and Central Gas to serve Thorne and Temiscaming. The major portion of the requirements for Temiscaming would be sold to the pulp and paper company Tembec.

- 6. In June 1979, Champion Pipeline applied to the National Energy Board for approval to construct and operate a town border station in the unincorporated Township of Poitras adjacent to TransCanada's proposed meter station, as well as a 1.8 kilometre transmission pipeline from the proposed town border station across the Ontario-Québec interprovincial border to the facilities of Le Gaz Provincial du Nord de Québec to be constructed in the Town of Temiscaming, Québec.
- 7. In January 1980, the National Energy Board determined that both the TCPL and Champion Pipeline proposed pipeline facilities were and will be required by the present and future public convenience and necessity. In 1985, Northern and Central (then known as ICG Utilities) sold its interest in Champion Pipeline and Le Gaz to Gaz Métro.
- 8. In March 1980, Northern and Central Gas applied to the Ontario Energy Board for an Order fixing the rates and other charges to be paid by consumers of natural gas in the unincorporated Township of Poitras. The proposed rates were approved in July 1980 per Order E.B.R.O. 364-II-8. The rates charged to customers within Thorne would be the same as the rates and charges applied to other customers operating in the Northern Zone.
- 9. Service to approximately 12 customers within the unincorporated community of Thorne was initiated in 1980 shortly after the Ontario Energy Board approved a tariff to serve these customers. There is no record of a Certificate being issued to Union for the unincorporated Township of Poitras or Thorne.
- 10. Attached hereto and marked as Schedules "A(1)" and "A(2)" are maps showing the location of the unincorporated Township of Poitras as well as customer density and metes & bounds descriptions of the area within the unincorporated Township of Poitras in which Union has facilities and provides service to end-use customers. The proposed Certificate area boundary starts at the TransCanada Pipeline and extends 250m west and 150m east of Highway 63 and extends to the north to include the Ottawa River Crossing to Long Sault Island as well as Long Sault Island.
- Union has a Franchise Agreement (RP-2000-0080 / EB-2000-0215) with and Certificate
 of Public Convenience and Necessity (FBC 21) for the City of North Bay which is the
 closest municipality to the unincorporated Township of Poitras.
- 12. Union is submitting this application for an Order under Section 8 of the *Municipal Franchises Act* based on the assumption that the doctrine of jurisdiction by necessary implication gives the Ontario Energy Board jurisdiction to issue a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity in respect of an unincorporated territory.
