# Application for electricity distribution rates and harmonizing rates and charges in the Cambridge and North Dumfries and Brant County service areas beginning January 1, 2019

## PROCEDURAL ORDER NO. 3 October 5, 2018

Energy+ Inc. (Energy+) filed a cost of service application with the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) on April 30, 2018 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, S.O. 1998, c. 15, (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that Energy+ charges for electricity distribution, to be effective January 1, 2019.

A Notice of Hearing was issued on May 28, 2018 followed by Procedural Order No.1 on July 26, 2018, in which the OEB set out the schedule of procedural steps. In Procedural Order No. 2, issued September 20, 2018, the OEB provided an extension for an intervenor, Toyota Motor Manufacturing Canada Inc. (TMMC), to file written evidence.

TMMC filed the written evidence of Jeffery C. Pollock and the written evidence of Melody Collis (collectively referred to as the written evidence) on September 27, 2018. TMMC requested confidential treatment for portions of the written evidence pursuant to the OEB's *Practice Direction on Confidential Filings* (Practice Direction). TMMC filed redacted versions of the written evidence for the public record of this proceeding and filed un-redacted versions confidentially with the OEB.

In its letter of September 27, 2018, TMMC identified specific portions of the written evidence for which it requested confidential treatment as follows:

Written Evidence of Jeffery C. Pollock:

- 1. Various portions throughout the entire document.
- 2. Schedule JP-1, Derivation of LDG Adjustment
- 3. Schedule JP-2, Electrical Single-Line Diagram of the Facilities Serving Large Use Customers
- 4. Schedule JP-3, Direct Assigned Feeder Costs
- 5. Schedule JP-4, Adjusted 4NCPand NCP Demand Allocation Factors Excluding TMMC
- 6. Schedule JP-5, Revised Class Cost-of-Service Study<sup>1</sup>
- 7. Schedule JP-6, Recommended Large Use Rate Design
- 8. Schedule JP-7, TMMC's Standby Service Requirements
- 9. Schedule JP-9, Revenues From Recommended Standby Distribution Service Rate

Written Evidence of Melody Collis:

- 10. Schedule MC-2, MMC Energy+ Hydro One Electrical Single Line Connection
- 11. Schedule MC-3, Aerial View of Connection Configuration
- 12. Schedule MC-4, Toyota Load Profile

TMMC stated, in its letter of September 27, 2018, that it seeks confidential treatment for the above-noted portions of the written evidence because they comprise commercially sensitive information and contain technical or proprietary data and analysis that have commercial value. The disclosure of the information could adversely affect the economic and/or competitive interests of TMMC and potentially result in undue financial loss.

At this time, the OEB is making provision for written submissions on TMMC's request for confidential treatment of portions of the written evidence. As an interim measure, counsel for intervenors that wish to make submissions on the request for confidentiality shall be granted access to the un-redacted documents provided they have executed the OEB's Declaration and Undertaking by filing it with the OEB with a copy to TMMC.

The OEB considers it necessary to make provision for the following matters related to this proceeding.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

- Intervenors that wish to review unredacted versions of TMMC's written evidence for which confidential treatment is sought will sign and file the OEB's Confidentiality Declaration and Undertaking form by no later than October 9, 2018.
- 2. TMMC will provide unredacted versions of the written evidence to intervenors who signed the OEB's Confidentiality Declaration and Undertaking by no later than **October 10, 2018**.
- OEB staff and intervenors that wish to file written submissions on TMMC's request for confidential treatment for portions of the written evidence shall file such submissions with the OEB and deliver them to all other parties on or before October 16, 2018.
- 4. If TTMC wishes to respond to any of the submissions, the reply submission must be filed with the OEB and delivered to all parties on or before **October 23, 2018.** The rest of the timelines set out in Procedural Oder No.1 remain unchanged.

All filings to the OEB must quote the file number, EB-2018-0028, be made in searchable / unrestricted PDF format electronically through the OEB's web portal at <a href="https://pes.ontarioenergyboard.ca/eservice/">https://pes.ontarioenergyboard.ca/eservice/</a>. Two paper copies must also be filed at the OEB's address provided below. Filings must clearly state the sender's name, postal address and telephone number, fax number and e-mail address. Parties must use the document naming conventions and document submission standards outlined in the RESS Document Guideline found at <a href="http://www.oeb.ca/Industry">http://www.oeb.ca/Industry</a>. If the web portal is not available parties may email their documents to the address below. Those who do not have internet access are required to submit all filings on a USB flash drive in PDF format, along with two paper copies. Those who do not have computer access are required to file 7 paper copies.
