## EnWin Utilities Ltd.

# Application for electricity distribution rates and other charges beginning January 1, 2020

### **PROCEDURAL ORDER NO. 3**

### September 17, 2019

EnWin Utilities Ltd. (EnWin Utilities) filed a cost of service application with the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) on April 26, 2019 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, *1998*, seeking approval for changes to the rates that EnWin Utilities charges for electricity distribution, to be effective January 1, 2020.

A settlement conference was held between the parties on August 22 and 23, 2019. The OEB issued Procedural Order No. 1 on June 21, 2019 which, among other things, required EnWin Utilities to file any settlement proposal by September 17, 2019. By letter dated September 17, 2019, EnWin Utilities requested an extension to September 24, 2019 to file a settlement proposal.

The OEB grants the extension. Accordingly, some dates established in Procedural Order No. 1 are superseded by the dates below.

### THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Any settlement proposal arising from the settlement conference shall be filed with the OEB on or before **September 24, 2019**. In addition to outlining the terms of any settlement, the settlement proposal should contain a list of any unsettled issues, indicating with reasons whether the parties believe those issues should be dealt with by way of oral or written hearing.
- 2. Any submission from OEB staff on a settlement proposal shall be filed with the OEB and served on all parties by **October 1, 2019**.
- 3. The OEB is still holding the tentative date of **October 4, 2019** from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at 2300 Yonge Street, 25<sup>th</sup> floor, Toronto, for EnWin Utilities to

present to the OEB any settlement proposal and a summary of any unsettled issues in the case. OEB staff will, at the direction of the OEB, confirm or amend this date in subsequent correspondence.

All filings to the OEB must quote the file number, **EB-2019-0032**, be made in searchable/unrestricted PDF format electronically through the OEB's web portal at <u>https://pes.oeb.ca/eservice/</u>. Two paper copies must also be filed at the OEB's address provided below. Filings must clearly state the sender's name, postal address and telephone number, fax number and e-mail address. Parties must use the document naming conventions and document submission standards outlined in the RESS Document Guideline found at <u>http://www.oeb.ca/OEB/Industry</u>. If the web portal is not available parties may email their documents to the address below. Those who do not have internet access are required to submit all filings on a USB memory stick in PDF format, along with two paper copies. Those who do not have computer access are required to file 7 paper copies.

All communications should be directed to the attention of the Registrar at the address below, and be received no later than 4:45 p.m. on the required date.
