Re: Enbridge Gas Inc.

Application for Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity Municipality of Thames Centre and the Municipality of Central Elgin

OEB File Number: EB-2019-0195

In accordance with Procedural Order No. 1, these are Enbridge Gas' reply submissions to OEB Staff's submissions dated September 16, 2019.

In their submissions, OEB Staff offered two ways to extend CPCN rights to allow Enbridge Gas to provide service to the 5 subdivisions identified in the application:

- 1) amend Enbridge Gas' existing CPCNs for each of the municipalities to specifically include the respective subdivisions; or
- 2) issue a new CPCN for each of the two municipalities, in which case the new CPCNs would be specific to the lots and concessions of each of the subdivisions

Enbridge Gas' preference is the 2nd option (issue subdivision-specific CPCNs) given the work underway to identify the CPCN rights of Enbridge Gas and EPCOR Natural Gas LP in the CPCN Overlap proceeding (EB-2017-0108) and the ability to easily cancel and supersede the subdivision-specific CPCNs once a final determination is made in the CPCN Overlap proceeding.

Enbridge Gas notes that our response to OEB Staff-1(b) should refer to the Kokomo Beach Club subdivision being located in the former Village of Port Stanley (not Southwold). See Attachment 1 for an updated interrogatory response.

With respect to the draft CPCNs proposed by OEB Staff in their submissions, Enbridge Gas recommends modifications as indicated on the attached revised draft CPCNs (Attachments 2 and 3).

Answer to Interrogatory from Board Staff

Reference: Application, pp. 2-3

Preamble:

Enbridge Gas Inc. (Enbridge Gas) has identified within the Municipality of Thames Centre and the Municipality of Central Elgin, five of the most immediate requests for service extensions for the following areas (the subdivisions):

- Boardwalk at Millpond Subdivision
- Rosewood Subdivision
- Foxborough Subdivision
- Hawthorne Park Subdivision
- Kokomo Beach Club Subdivision

Questions:

- (a) Please confirm, for each of the subdivisions, that none of the proposed service extensions will be located within areas currently covered under Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) held by EPCOR Natural Gas Limited Partnership.
- (b) Please provide the specific lots and concessions in the Municipality of Thames Centre and the Municipality of Central Elgin that each of the subdivisions will be located in.
- (c) As the requested amendments to the CPCNs for the Municipality of Thames Centre and the Municipality of Central Elgin have not yet been issued, pending a final decision in the EB-2017-0108 proceeding, please confirm that no construction has been initiated to construct the facilities to service the subdivisions. If construction has been initiated, please outline what has been completed.
- (d) For each of the subdivisions, please provide details regarding the anticipated total length of pipeline required, type of pipeline, volumetric throughput, operating pressure of the pipeline, and estimated project cost. Further, please outline if Enbridge Gas will need to file a leave to construct application for the construction of the pipelines to service any of the subdivisions. Will a system expansion surcharge be required for constructing the pipeline to service any of the subdivisions?
- (e) Please provide details of the approvals that have been obtained, as well as any additional approvals that will be required for the construction and operation of the proposed pipelines for each of the subdivisions.

Enbridge plans to service 4 of the subdivisions at this time. The developer for the Hawthorne Park subdivision is in the process of the finalizing the conceptual plan for this development so details for providing service to this subdivision have not been finalized.

A leave to construct application is not required to service any of these subdivisions given the cost of the projects and the facilities being installed. A system expansion surcharge is not required as these projects are being completed under the EBO 188 guidelines.

(e) For these projects, Enbridge is required to obtain a municipal approval / work permits. If the project crosses a county road, work permits are also required from the upper-tier government.

The table below provides the approvals required for each subdivision and the status of the consents.
