This office has reviewed the above-mentioned report, which has been submitted to this ministry as a condition of licensing in accordance with Part VI of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c 0.18.¹ This review has been carried out in order to determine whether the licensed professional consultant archaeologist has met the terms and conditions of their licence, that the licensee assessed the property and documented archaeological resources using a process that accords with the 2011 *Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists* set by the ministry, and that the archaeological fieldwork and report recommendations are consistent with the conservation, protection and preservation of the cultural heritage of Ontario.

The report documents the assessment of the McCurdy site (BbHh-11) as depicted in Figures 1 and 8 and of the above titled report and recommends the following:

As 80% of the artifact assemblage does not represent a period of use that dates to before 1870, the site does not retain further cultural heritage value or interest as per Section 3.4 of the MTCS' 2011 Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists (Government of Ontario 2011). Therefore, in accordance with Section 7.9.4 Standard 5 of the MTCS' 2011 Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists (Government of Ontario 2011), it has been determined that the cultural heritage value or interest of the McCurdy site (BbHh-11) has been sufficiently documented and Stage 4 mitigation of impacts is not required for the site.

The MTCS is asked to review the results presented and accept this report into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Reports.

Based on the information contained in the report, the ministry is satisfied that the fieldwork and reporting for

the archaeological assessment are consistent with the ministry's 2011 Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists and the terms and conditions for archaeological licences. This report has been entered into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Reports.
