I own a second property in a subdivision. It has been deemed seasonal and I pay outrages rates when my neighbors are paying far less \$30 vs \$40. My electricity use is \$35.59 and my delivery is \$164.73 This is biased treatment and resulting in isolating me because I have 2 homes in Ontario with a monopoly-Hydro 1. I have no choice this is extortion. To be treated differently than my neighbor is outrageous. This neighborhood is attached to a town-not in a remote location. This demonstrates prejudicial treatment...it means Hydro 1 assumes because I have 2 homes I can afford to pay -bad assumption-I am a 62-year-old widow working hard to hold on. if my second home was in Manitoba I would not be considered seasonal...and therefore be at risk of these crippling rates. I share my time between the 2 properties...why do I have to make a choice as to where the gouging takes place-there should be no gouging. I should be charged the same as my neighbor
