
ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD NOTICE

Enbridge Gas Inc. has applied for approval to construct 1.2 kilometres of natural gas pipeline and ancillary facilities in the Township of St. Clair, in the County of Lambton.

If the application is approved as filed, the project would involve the construction of a 1.2 kilometre, 20-inch natural gas pipeline and ancillary facilities. The proposed natural gas pipeline will extend from Enbridge Gas Inc.'s Dow Valve Site to the Bluewater Interconnect, at a new LaSalle Pipeline Valve Site, south of the existing Bluewater Interconnect Station, in the Township of St. Clair. A map showing the location of the proposed pipeline is below:



Enbridge Gas Inc. is also asking the Ontario Energy Board to approve the form of land use agreements it offers to landowners to use their land for routing and construction of the proposed pipeline and ancillary facilities.

Enbridge Gas Inc. says that the project is needed to serve rising demand in the Sarnia area.

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD IS HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider Enbridge Gas' application. During this hearing, which could be a written or an oral hearing, the OEB will consider evidence and arguments by Enbridge Gas and by others who have

registered to participate in the hearing (individuals, municipalities and others whose interests would be affected).

As part of its review of this application, the OEB will assess Enbridge Gas' compliance with the OEB's Environmental Guidelines for the Location, Construction and Operation of Hydrocarbon Pipelines and Facilities in Ontario.

The OEB will also assess whether the duty to consult with Indigenous Communities potentially affected by the proposed pipeline has been discharged with respect to the application.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can review the application filed by Enbridge Gas on the OEB's website now.
- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.
- You can become an active participant (called an intervenor). Intervenors can provide evidence, argue their positions and submit questions to be answered by Enbridge Gas. Apply by **December 2, 2019** or the hearing will go ahead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding.
- At the end of the process, you can review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website.

ORAL VS. WRITTEN HEARINGS

There are two types of OEB hearings – oral and written. Enbridge Gas has applied for a written hearing. The OEB is considering this request. If you think an oral hearing is needed, you can write to the OEB to explain why by **December 2, 2019.**

PRIVACY

If you write a letter of comment, your name and the content of your letter will be put on the public record and the OEB website. However, your personal telephone number, home address and email address will be removed. If you are a business, all your information will remain public. If you apply to become an intervenor, all information will be public.

This hearing will be held under sections 90(1) and 97 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998, c.15 (Schedule B).
