Imperial is submitting to the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries (the “Ministry”) the following reports for its review and comment in accordance with the Ontario Energy Board’s *Environmental Guidelines for the Location, Construction and Operation of Hydrocarbon Pipeline Facilities in Ontario* (7<sup>th</sup> edition):

Further to the Ministry’s letter dated December 2, 2019, an Existing Conditions Report (“ECR”) for built heritage resources and cultural heritage landscapes pursuant to Ontario Regulations 9/06 and 10/06.

In addition, Imperial is submitting three Heritage Impact Assessments (“HIAs”) for properties of cultural heritage value or of local municipal significance. Based on the ECR findings, the Project has identified the following three properties as receiving potential direct or indirect short or long term physical impacts from the Project:

- 5071 No. 2 Side Road, Burlington
- 4415 Mississauga Road, Mississauga
- Centennial Park, Toronto

To support continued safe, reliable, and environmentally responsible transportation of refined products used by households and businesses in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area, Imperial is planning to construct and operate a new pipeline that will replace the transportation capabilities of the existing Sarnia Products Pipeline.

The Waterdown to Finch Project is the proposed installation of approximately 62 kilometres of pipeline between the company’s pump station in rural Hamilton (Waterdown Station) and its terminal storage facility in Toronto’s North York area (Finch Terminal).
