NOTICE OF INTERVENTION

OF THE

SCHOOL ENERGY COALITION

1. The School Energy Coalition (“SEC”) applies for intervenor status in this proceeding.
1. SEC is a frequent intervenor in Board proceedings. Our current Annual Filing can be found on the Board’s website, here:

2. The School Energy Coalition intends to apply for recovery of its costs reasonably incurred in the course of its intervention in this matter. SEC has participated in many past natural gas and electricity proceedings in Ontario, including consultations, rate cases, and other processes and hearings, and has been found eligible to be paid its reasonably incurred costs in all of those proceedings.

Issues to be Addressed

3. SEC’s intended participation will include the following, with a particular focus on geo-targeted DSM:
 - a. The need for the proposed facilities, if any;
 - b. The costs and benefits of the proposed facilities;
 - c. The extent, if any, that the Applicant can avoid or defer the facilities through targeted conservation activities, consistent with past guidance from the Board;
 - d. The proposed generic IRP process, including the appropriateness of considering that process within an individual facilities application, and if the Board determines to do so, the steps, structure, and overall design of the proposed IRP process; and
 - e. Generally to represent the interests of school boards and their students in this process.

The Intervenor’s Intended Participation

4. SEC intends to participate in any pre-hearing procedures, including interrogatories or technical conferences, and settlement conferences. SEC also intends to participate in

any oral hearing of this matter, and in written or oral submissions, as well as any other parts of the process that the Board should order. While SEC does not currently intend to file evidence in this proceeding, it reserves its right to do so depending on the responses to interrogatories and any other discovery processes ordered by the Board.

Nature of Hearing Requested

5. Until interrogatories have been answered, we believe it is premature to assess whether a written or an oral hearing is more appropriate in this proceeding.
