- In its Decision and Order dated August 7, 2013 (Designation Decision), the Ontario Energy Board (OEB or Board) named Upper Canada Transmission, Inc. (UCT), doing business as NextBridge Infrastructure (NextBridge), as the designated transmitter for the development of the East-West Tie transmission line (EWT Project or Project).
- On July 31, 2017, NextBridge submitted an application for leave to construct (LTC) the EWT Project, pursuant to section 92 of the Ontario Energy Board Act (OEB Act). On February 11, 2019, the OEB issued a Decision and Order approving the LTC application and amending the conditions of UCT's Electricity Transmission Licence to authorize it to proceed to the construction, expansion or reinforcement of the transmission system for the EWT Project, pursuant to a directive to the OEB issued by the Minister of Energy, Northern Development and Mines and approved by Order in Council 52/2019 (OIC), dated January 30, 2019.
- On February 11, 2019, the OEB amended NextBridge's Electricity Transmission Licence to include conditions requiring NextBridge to report to the IESO on the progress, timeliness and costeffectiveness of the EWT Project and provide such information that the OEB may from time to time require.
- On July 29, 2019, the OEB issued a letter outlining NextBridge's reporting requirements pursuant to sections 14.1 and 13.3 of its Electricity Transmission Licence.
- In accordance with the OEB's letter dated July 29, 2019, NextBridge will report quarterly on the 15th business day of each January, April, July, and October. NextBridge will continue reporting until the EWT Project is in-service and land restoration activities have been completed.



1. Summary of the EWT Project Progress During Reporting Period

A. Table of Key Project Statuses

Stage of Construction	 Construction activities have commenced. Transmission line right of way (ROW) clearing commenced in September 2019 on WF 1 and WF 7 started in December 2019. Additional information on this topic can be found in Section 1. B. below. 				
Costs	 NextBridge continues to maintain focus on the budget and tracks updates monthly. Construction costs for the EWT Project are forecasted to be on budget as compared to the LTC application. Additional information on this topic can be found in Section 3. below. 				
Schedule	 Permit and access requests are on track but approval delays have resulted in construction startup delays. NextBridge is making continuous efforts with the applicable parties and governmental agencies, including Ministry of the Environment, Conservation, and Parks (MECP), Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF), Ministry of Energy, Northern Development and Mines (MENDM), Ministry of Transportation, and Infrastructure Ontario (MTO), Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO), Canada Wildlife Service (CWS), Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC), NAV Canada, Transport Canada, Indigenous engagement, and others, in order to maintain the current schedule. Construction startup delays have resulted in less construction activities undertaken during the 2019-2020 winter season than originally planned. Delays experienced to date will be analyzed to determine if there are any cost and/or schedule impacts after the 2020 winter construction season concludes. Emerging Risks	Delay in finalizing acquisition with outstanding mining leaseholders. • NextBridge continues to work towards mutually acceptable agreements to

	 obtain required consent agreements and easements. o NextBridge anticipates resolution in Q1 of 2020. Delay of finalizing acquisition with mining leaseholders may require construction to skip certain areas. While the construction contract anticipated skipping certain areas for potential issues, the length of delay may result in increased cost to NextBridge. These conditions place uncertainty in the timing of permitting approvals, which could impact construction execution plans. The Project team is working on mitigating the realization of this risk by continuing engagement with the impacted rights holders and relevant Government agencies to ensure timely approval of the required permits and evaluating construction execution plans in impacted areas. Delay in finalizing acquisition with outstanding mining claim holders. NextBridge has reached agreement with all but two mining claim holders. The Mining and Lands Tribunal (MLT) has scheduled hearings for these matters, to take place in April 2020. This will delay access to the subject lands for construction and may result in skips and increased cost to NextBridge.
Indigenous Activities	 Engagement continuing. NextBridge continues to engage with the 18 identified Indigenous communities in the Project area. Engagement highlights include robust consultations on permitting, including notifications, permitting workshops and the provision of capacity funding for communities to retain third party experts if required. NextBridge re-committed to ongoing consultation on the permits to address concerns at any point, including post-issuance of permits. Section 28.2 Permit negotiations are continuing with the two communities in which the Project crosses First Nations lands and progressing towards conclusion. Negotiations are taking place between Pic Mobert First Nation, NextBridge and the Federal Government to secure approvals for access requirements over Additions to Reserve Lands which the Project requires temporary use. NextBridge representatives organized Indigenous Facilitator training and has launched the Indigenous Facilitator Program which will support on-site





C. Summary of Activities Within Reporting Period

Environment

- Species at Risk (SAR)
 - Received Overall Benefits Permit (OBP) for SAR from the MECP on December 24, 2019.
 - The Permit included multiple conditions requiring actions to avoid impact to SAR and mitigate for impacts to habitat.
 - The pre-construction conditions are being met and the post construction activities are in the process of being reviewed to understand the scope of the requirements.

DPPs

- DPPs have been submitted on all WFs.
- All DPPs for Provincial Parks and Conservation Reserves have been submitted with the exception of Gravel River Provincial Park, Nimoosh Provincial Park and Kama Cliffs Conservation Reserve.

WF Packages

- Permit applications for all WFs were submitted.
- Permits were issued for WFs 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, and 9.
- Continued productive discussions with:
 - MECP on Provincial Parks and Conservation Reserves Management Plan amendments;
 and
 - O MNRF on work and land use permits, etc.

Permitting Requirements

 Continued consultation with MECP, MNRF, DFO, CWS and other agencies regarding the Environmental Assessment (EA) and upcoming permitting requirements.

EA Conditions

- Internal and contractor resources have been deployed to ensure continuous compliance with the conditions of the EA Approval using a comprehensive Construction Compliance Matrix for tracking purposes.
- NextBridge is preparing an annual compliance report outlining the results of the compliance monitoring program to submitted to the Director of the Environmental Assessment and Permissions Branch of the MECP.

Environment-Related Indigenous Discussions





- Continued solicitation and incorporation of feedback and Traditional Ecologic Knowledge information provided by First Nation and Métis communities and agencies.
- Documented and responded to inquiries received from First Nations and Métis with respect to the Project.
- Supported multiple Permitting Workshops and conference calls with First Nations and Métis representatives and their consultants.
- Supported multiple Indigenous Facilitator training sessions.
 - Indigenous Facilitators have been present along the ROW since the commencement of construction.
 - O NextBridge continues to work with Project partners and Indigenous Communities to improve the Indigenous Facilitator Program structure and delivery.

Land

Privately Held Land

- Negotiated settlement with two additional property owners resulting in reduction of parcels subject to expropriation proceedings from 12 to 5.
 - NextBridge continues to work with the remaining property owners included in the expropriation application to reach a negotiated settlement.
- Meetings with property owners to execute option exercise and easement registration documentation.
 - All signed option agreements across the EWT Project have now been exercised.

Government Land and Permits

- Continued engagement with the MTO and Infrastructure Ontario to acquire land rights and/or obtain permits.
- Executed Grant of Easement agreements for 2 properties owned by MTO and 14 properties administered by Infrastructure Ontario on behalf of the Ministry of Governmental and Consumer Services.
- Obtained entrance, land use and building, and encroachment permit approvals from the MTO for locations within WFs 1, 7, 2, 8 and 6.
 - O Permit applications for all other WFs are under review by the MTO with the remaining approvals expected by the Post-LTC Decision Baseline Target Dates⁶.
- Crown land disposition applications for all WFs were submitted to the MNRF in September,
 October and November 2019, in line with Post-LTC Decision Baseline Target Dates⁷.

- Obtained Crown land use permit and work permit approvals from the MNRF for WF 1, 7, 2 and 6.
 - O Permit applications for all other WFs are under review by the MNRF with the remaining approvals expected by the Post-LTC Decision Baseline Target Dates⁸.
- Continued engagement with third party utility and rail companies to secure required access and overhead crossing approvals.
- Agreements securing approximately 89% of required third party crossings have been completed.
 NextBridge anticipates completing the remaining third-party crossing agreements in early 2020.
 - A revised milestone target date has been specified in Table B.

General Updates

- Continued legal surveys to support the land optioning and permitting programs.
- Responded to directly affected property owner and Crown interest holder inquiries, as required.

Regulatory

- Expropriation Application
 - On November 5, 2019, NextBridge filed with the OEB Expropriation Plans in relation to 10 of the
 12 parcels subject to expropriation proceedings and requested the OEB's approval and endorsement of the Plans.
 - On December 3, 2019, the OEB issued a revision to its September 12, 2019 Order and Decision granting NextBridge authority to expropriate.
 - O The revision was to confirm that the 4 and 7 year terms of the Temporary Easements are appropriate.
 - On December 13, 2019, NextBridge advised the OEB that it had reached negotiated settlements with two additional property owners, and as a result, expropriation is no longer necessary for 7 of the 12 properties that are the subject of the expropriation proceeding.
 - After being approved and endorsed by the OEB, the expropriation plans for the remaining 5 properties were registered at the applicable Ontario Land Registry Offices on December 5 and 12, 2019.
 - In accordance with the Expropriations Act, the landowners of the 5 properties were deemed to have been served with the registered plans and the Notices of Expropriation, Possession, and Election on December 11 and 16, 2019.

- On October 1, 2019, MENDM referred three matters to the MLT for resolution, pursuant to Section 51 of the Ontario *Mining Act*, regarding the use of the surface rights on unpatented mining claims required for the Project.
- Between October 23, 2019 and November 11, 2019, NextBridge participated in series of mediation calls, resulting in settlement with one mining claim holder.
 - O NextBridge was unable to reach a resolution with the two other mining claim holders.
- On November 22, 2019, the MLT issued a Direction to File letter to NextBridge and the two remaining mining claim holders.
- On December 10, 2019, the MLT issued Notices of Hearing outlining the hearings dates and location.
 - O The hearings are scheduled to take place on April 21/22 and April 23/24, 2019 in Thunder Bay, Ontario.
- In accordance with the Direction to File, on December 19, 2019, NextBridge filed and served the materials that it will be relying upon at the hearings.

Indigenous Engagement

- Continued Engagement Activities
 - Discussions with the 18 identified First Nation and Métis communities regarding the EWT Project are ongoing.
 - Regularly engaged with interested communities consulting on Project permitting.
 - Additional consultation and engagement was undertaken with Biinjitiwabik Zaaging
 Anishnabek (BZA) through the MNRF regarding permitting requirements in WFs 1 through 7.
 - O Progress was made in relation to the approvals of permits in WFs 1,2,6 and 7, but approvals for permits in WFs 3,4 and 5 are outstanding.
 - NextBridge is committed to addressing concerns at any point, even post issuance of permits and engage communities on an issue by issue basis.
 - To support this work, NextBridge continued hosting permitting workshops and meetings that were offered to all identified 18 First Nation and Métis communities in November and December with over five events held, including;
 - November 19, 2019 Permitting workshop held in Biinjitiwabik Zaaging Anishnabek
 (BZA) First Nation with community leadership;
 - December 2, 2019 Permitting workshop held in BZA First Nation with community members and leadership;
 - December 9, 2019 Teleconference workshop held with Pic Mobert First Nation community consultants and representatives on permitting inquiries associated with WFs 7 & 8:





- December 17, 2019 Permitting workshop held with BZA First Nation community consultants and community leadership in Thunder Bay; and
- December 19, 2019 Teleconference workshop held with Michipicoten First Nation community consultants on permitting inquiries associated with WF 11.
- BZA continues to pursue a judicial review in regards to the issuance of the NextBridge LTC and OIC.

Community/Municipal Engagement

- Continued Engagement Activities
 - Municipal elected officials, along with many others, attended a ribbon cutting ceremony on October 2, 2019.
 - Email sent to elected representatives on October 31, 2019 informing of changes to the September construction schedule that was previously provided to them in September 2019.
 - Newspaper advertisements began to run in the Project area the week of November 11, 2019 informing the public of the availability of the construction schedule, DPPs, and contact information for the Community Liaison who manages construction related issues and complaints.
 - Additional radio advertisements asking listeners to visit the Project website (<u>www.NextBridge.ca</u>) for updates to the Project schedule and DPPs ran the week of December 2, 2019.
 - Presented a Project update at the IESO Regional Forum on November 12, 2019.
 - O The event was attended by several municipal and Indigenous representatives from the Project area.
 - All WF related DPPs were posted to the Project website as of December 16, 2019.
 - Some Parks and Conservation Reserve DPPs have been posted and the remaining will be once they are finalized.
 - Project Facebook Group established during the previous Reporting Period continued to grow steadily with approximately 50 members as of the end of Reporting Period.
 - Invitations were sent to communities and elected officials with a Facebook presence to join the Project Facebook Group during the week of October 7, 2019.
 - Monitored the Project email address and hotline for Project inquiries.
- Complaint Resolution Process
 - No formal complaints were submitted during this Reporting Period.
- Community Investment
 - Provided support to groups in eight municipalities for events and initiatives in 2019.

- Deliveries of conductor reels are ongoing and well in advance of conductor stringing schedule.
- Deliveries of Overhead Ground Wire (OHGW) reels are ongoing and well in advance of conductor stringing schedule.
- Deliveries of Optical Ground Wire (OPGW) reels are ongoing and well in advance of conductor stringing schedule.
- Tower deliveries have commenced and over 100 towers have been delivered to the Project site.

Detailed Engineering

- Transmission line design Issued for Construction Review (IFCR) packages for all WFs have been issued and Issued for Construction (IFC) packages are being issued as ROW is cleared and ground-truthing is being performed.
- Performing Grounding Studies to optimize the grounding design.

Coordination Efforts with HONI

- Status and Changes to Access Road and Transmission Line Crossings
 - Continued engagement with HONI to acquire necessary land rights and/or obtain permits.
 - Obtained approval from HONI for longitudinal (land) access associated with all WFs.
 - Met with HONI and IESO regarding overhead transmission line crossing designs.
 - O HONI has approved NextBridge crossing T1M lines.
 - O NextBridge reached agreement with HONI on outstanding crossing items, including T1M and secured agreements in writing on December 20, 2019.
 - Crossing outside of Lakehead TS is outstanding.
 - O Subject to HONI approval of draft reference plans and confirmation of structure location immediate outside of Wawa TS.
 - Expect to conclude agreement in 1Q 2020.
 - Work sequence has been adjusted to address timing of crossing agreement and no schedule impacts are expected as a result of this outcome.


B. <u>Milestone Updates</u>
