**RE: EB-2019-0247 Enbridge Gas Inc.- 2020 Carbon Pricing
Energy Probe Revised Intervenor Request Letter**

By letter dated January 20, 2020 Energy Probe Research Foundation (Energy Probe) had applied for intervenor status in the EB-2019-0247 proceeding, the application by Enbridge Gas Inc. to the Ontario Energy Board for approval of its 2020 carbon pricing proposal. Energy Probe's letter omitted to provide specific information regarding its interest in this proceeding. Energy Probe sincerely apologizes for this omission and hopes that the OEB will accept this revised intervenor request letter and allow its intervention.

Statement of Substantial Interest

Energy Probe is an environmental and consumer organization which promotes economic efficiency in the use of resources. Energy Probe will be representing its natural gas residential and small commercial customer supporters in Ontario, which we have some number of thousands. Energy Probe's supporters will be directly affected by the outcome of this proceeding through significant bill impacts on residential and small commercial customers as shown in Exhibits D, Tab 1, Schedule 2 for EGD, and Tab 2, Schedule 2 for Union Rate Zones. In order to protect the interests of its supporters, Energy Probe will focus on the following two concerns that it hopes will be dealt with in this proceeding.

1. Do Enbridge's proposed rate changes agree with the methodology approved by the OEB in the EB-2018-0205 Decision?

2. Are the 2019 balances recorded in Enbridge's FCPP-related deferral and variance accounts appropriate?

Hearing

Costs
