To the Ontario Energy Board,

I am writing to provide comments on the Enbridge 2021 Dawn Parkway Expansion (#EB-2019-0159). I strongly believe that you must consider the climate emergency when reviewing the proposed new 48" Enbridge fracked gas pipeline across Hamilton, and indeed, in reviewing any future applications of this nature.

The climate emergency is possibly the most important economic, environmental and social issue of our time, and so should be considered in all decisions that we make. We are running out of time to contain climate change to a level that will not pose an existential threat to humanity and much of life on earth. We simply cannot make any more decisions that lead us in the wrong direction.
