I am asking that the Ontario environmental board to consider the negative impact of such a pipeline in the Flamborough area for the following reasons. These reasons together with the many others submitted will equip the board to refuse the approval for such a pipeline at any time.

1. Encouraging the fracking process and the burning of natural gas is only adding to climate damage and the climate crisis. This crisis is well documented and excepted and should not be ignored. A project of this scale would only be adding to that damage. Even if there is scepticism about climate crisis it is never appropriate to unnecessarily exploit resources and damage sensitive lands.
