Enbridge Gas is writing in response to a letter filed by Pollution Probe on March 18, 2020, requesting intervenor status in the above noted proceeding. Within its letter, Pollution Probe presents the issues it wishes to explore through its participation in this proceeding, including the impact to ratepayers of the proposed Project.

Enbridge Gas believes that the issues presented by Pollution Probe in its intervention request are out of scope for this proceeding. Enbridge Gas is seeking Board approval for a leave to vary the Maximum Operating Pressure (MOP) of three Storage Pools: Black Creek, Coveny and Wilkesport (Project). In the past, the Board has imposed conditions of approval limiting the MOP of these storage pools.

As indicated in the pre-filed evidence, the additional storage capacity created by the Project will be sold to third parties as part of Enbridge Gas's unregulated storage portfolio. All costs related to the Project will be at the shareholder's expense. As such, there are no impacts to ratepayers. In accordance with the Board's decision in the Natural Gas Electricity Interface Review proceeding (NGEIR decision), any new capacity added to the storage pools is allocated to Enbridge Gas's unregulated storage operations. Pollution Probe is seeking to review the 2006 NGEIR decision through the back door of its intervention request and is well out of time to do so.

Enbridge Gas therefore objects to Pollution Probe's request for intervention in the above noted proceeding.
