NOTICE OF INTERVENTION

OF

H2GO CANADA

A. Application for Intervenor Status

- H2GO Canada (H2GO) hereby requests intervenor status in the matter of the application of Enbridge Gas Inc. (the Applicant) for an order or orders pursuant to section 90 of the Act to construct natural gas distribution pipelines and ancillary facilities and an order or orders pursuant to section 36 of the Act approving a rate rider to be applied to customers as set out in the Applicant's application filed March 31, 2020 (the Application). This notice of intervention is filed pursuant to Rule 22 of the Board's *Rules of Practice and Procedure*.
- 2. H2GO's participation would focus on the following issues, if the Board accepts its application for intervenor status, including:
 - (a) injection of hydrogen into the gas distribution system and related enhancements to greenhouse gas emissions reductions;
 - (b) hydrogen production via the power to gas (PtG) method described in the Application;
 - (c) the use of hydrogen blending and natural gas infrastructure as storage resources to establish an intertie between the electrical grid and the natural gas distribution system; and
 - (d) the suitability of the pilot project in providing insight into the use of hydrogen as a method for decarbonizing the natural gas grid and complying with the requirements of the forthcoming Clean Fuel Standard (CFS).

B. <u>H2GO and its Interest in the Proceeding</u>

- 3. H2GO is a not for profit organization established to help accelerate the development of sustainable markets for low-carbon hydrogen and hydrogen technologies in Canada. Its organizing vision is that hydrogen becomes a fully developed, low-carbon energy pathway for heat, power, and mobility in Canada, supported by commercially vibrant markets and mature supply chains. Accordingly, H2GO's mission is to help make hydrogen systems and storage solutions a practical option for organizations in Canada that are seeking to reduce emissions within their operations. We do this by cultivating conditions for hydrogen markets to develop, grow, and thrive.
- 4. The Applicant acknowledges that successful implementation of the pilot project will support it in pursuing additional and larger scale hydrogen blending activities in other parts of its distribution system. H2GO hopes to provide the Board with the perspective of

hydrogen production, compression and purification, storage, distribution, and use in Canada, all of which may be materially affected by the outcome of this proceeding. H2GO is well positioned to contribute to the development of Canada's hydrogen economy and has a keen interest in the proceeding given its potential to promote the growth and development of companies focused on renewable energy and green technologies.

C. <u>Nature and Scope of H2GO's Intended Participation</u>

5. H2GO intends to be an active participant in this proceeding and will act responsibly to coordinate with other intervenors where common issues may arise and be otherwise addressed. H2GO otherwise intends to participate actively in order to test evidence in accordance with the stipulated processes and timelines, and provide argument. It reserves the right to adduce evidence should the Board's procedures provide for same.

D. <u>Costs</u>

6. H2GO is eligible to seek an award of costs in accordance with s. 3.03(b) of the Board's *Practice Direction on Cost Awards*, as H2GO is a not-for-profit entity representing a non-commercial, non-competitive interest and policy perspective that is relevant to the Board's mandate to promote energy conservation and energy efficiency and to the proceeding. H2GO's expertise in hydrogen production, compression and purification, storage, distribution, and use will assist the Board in reviewing and deciding upon the Application.
