Lagasco Inc. has applied to the Ontario Energy Board for an order declaring that the natural gas pipelines owned by Lagasco Inc. in Haldimand County are not "pipe lines" within the meaning of section 25 of the *Assessment Act*, and were not "pipe lines" within the meaning of section 25 of the *Assessment Act*, at any time on or after January 1, 2015.

Lagasco Inc. says that it has appealed the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation's assessment of property taxes levied against it because it believes the assessment incorrectly treats its gathering pipelines in Haldimand County as transmission pipelines. Lagasco Inc. says that unlike transmission pipelines, its gathering pipelines are only used to collect gas from local production wells and transport it for treatment before delivery to the Local Distributor's transmission system.

Lagasco Inc. says that it maintains the same position for similarly situated pipelines it owns in Ontario, in the municipalities of Bayham, Central Elgin, Chatham, Dutton/Dunwich, Enniskillen, Essex, Fort Erie, Kingsville, Lakeshore, Leamington, Malahide, Norfolk, Port Colborne, Southwold, Wainfleet and West Elgin.

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD IS HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider the application filed by Lagasco Inc. We will question Lagasco Inc. on the case. We will also hear questions and arguments from individuals and groups that register to participate (intervenors) in the case. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide on Lagasco Inc.'s request.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.
