On June 1, 2020, Ameresco JPII Carbon Reduction Inc.'s (Ameresco) applied to the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) for a for an electricity storage licence. By letter dated June 11, 2020 (<u>June 11th Letter</u>), the OEB informed you that your application was incomplete and could not be processed for the reasons provided in the letter. The OEB allowed 30 days to file the requested information.

As the OEB has not received information requested in the June 11th Letter, this letter is to inform you that your application for an electricity storage licence will be closed within 10 days of the date of this letter unless the OEB receives the required information.

Ameresco is reminded that pursuant to section 57 (c) of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, no person can generate electricity or provide ancillary services for sale through the IESO-administered markets or directly to another person without a licence.
