**RE: Reporting Requirements – Amendments to the Standard Supply Service Code**

Dear Ms. Long:

On September 8, 2020, the Ontario Energy Board (“OEB”) issued a notice advising of the adoption of the final amendments to the Standard Supply Service Code (“SSSC”). These amendments, which came into force on October 13, 2020, will enable electricity consumers on the Regulated Price Plan (“RPP”) to opt-out of Time-of-Use (“TOU”) prices and to elect instead to be charged on the basis of tiered pricing.

On October 2, 2020, the OEB issued a letter to all licensed electricity distributors *Re: Implementing the Process for Enabling Customers to Opt Out of Time-of-Use Pricing: Communications, Reporting Requirements and Smart Metering Entity Data*, which introduced the following reporting requirement:

*“No later than October 19, 2020, each licensed, rate-regulated distributor shall confirm in writing whether it has adapted its systems and processes to enable it to comply with the amendments to the SSSC that came into force on October 13, 2020.”*
