-- Comments --

Although I understand the need to better charge for utilization according to density, it seems the smallest users are impacted the most financially with this new program. I have a seasonal cottage and use it roughly May - October, so I assume I am in the 50kWh or R2 class. However, seeing a 100% increase in my bill, or \$600/year, seems extreme. It seems to me that if you want to better reflect usage, than the onus is on you to better define it and not implement such dramatic increase. If you are not happy with the seasonal program, develop an algorithm to better capture individual usages. As I understand it, you estimate usage on a semi annual basis and bill accordingly. The next highest increase on your table is 54%. Everyone else pays less. This appears to be geographical or population discrimination and should be reconsidered.
