Dear Committee,

I was shocked to see your proposal (which has been slammed down our throats- stating the decision to get rid of seasonal class has already been made) in my mailbox today. For a family on a modest income using a seasonal property, your proposal as it stands, would see my 50kWh monthly consumption bill increase by 100%. Furthermore, you think it is okay to justify this increase by saying you will "phase" the increases in-- but no timeline. How about phasing it in over 20 years? Why were we not allowed to participate in the original decision of getting rid of seasonal classes? Why in your infinite wisdom do you reward someone with high consumption less % INCREASE in their bill than someone like myself, who wants to conserve energy. What happened to the concept of trying to conserve energy? Perhaps you can reexamine some of your ideas for billing--(changing to fixed rates- etc.) to reduce the increase to say 50%. A doubling or 100% increase in my rates is ridiculous.
