Like many other full time residents that currently live in an area that happens to be designated as "Seasonal" by your definition, I cannot help but try to make sense of the proposed changes.

- If I live in Newfoundland and send a letter to my next door neighbour, the cost of a stamp is \$1.10. This is the same cost as if I was to send to a friend in Victoria, BC. Yet the logistics, cost to ship is much higher.
- If I am in Toronto and take the subway for one stop, the cost is \$3.05, yet I can go from Scarborough Town Centre all the way to Pearson Airport for that exact same fare.
- I can call my brother around the block on the phone for the same cost as I can make a call to a relative in Nunavut.

I believe you see the point of my examples.

The proposed solution is inequitable.

If Hydro One was to propose a price increase for Visible Minorities and a reduction for White customers, would this be approved?

In an era where corporations are constantly promoting themselves as equitable, inclusive and non-discriminatory, I feel that this proposed solution is the complete opposite and I am embarrassed as a Canadian and disgusted that this notion is being entertained and respectfully ask you to re-consider.
