I am writing about a cabin owned by my sister, brother, and myself located on a busy highway. It is between Cloyne and Denbigh; there is a mix of seasonal cottages, year round homes, and small businesses. Our quarterly electric bill is approximately \$120. The cabin is usually occupied 4 to 5 weeks per summer, and we shut off the power through the fall, winter, and spring months. Of course, it was empty this past year because the border has been closed. I believe that a review of our actual electricity usage is quite low. We seem to already be paying for distribution services along that section of Highway 41. Our cabin is not across the lake on an island, nor located on a side street or in the woods. The letter received stated that "Hydro One Networks anticipates that you will move into the residential low density {R2} class." If so, our monthly/quarterly electric bill will increase significantly. I am hoping that the Ontario Energy Board is able to address this concern favorably for my family.
