We have reviewed the notice Hydro One has sent to seasonal properties. The current category of Seasonal Property is to be eliminated with a proposal of increases January 1, 2022 or later.

Currently invoices are based on time of day consumption with low/mid/peak hours over a quarterly period. The proposed new chart is based on monthly consumption based on total usage over 12 months. This seems to benefit Hydro One to ensure a large monthly billing even in off-season (unused). If we are in no way using any power there should be no charges. For years we have been paying delivery charges just for the privilege of power being available, not used - what will happen with those charges? This proposal seems totally unacceptable to those of us who own/use a seasonal residence seasonally (May long weekend to October long weekend) only. Our years of seasonal usage only should be quite apparent to Hydro One's records.

We certainly ask that Hydro One/OEB review and maintain the current process.
