Re: EB-2020-0246 - OEB Proceeding - Hydro One Networks Inc. - Elimination of the Seasonal Rate Class

I am a consultant to the Consumers Council of Canada ("Council"). I have been instructed by my client to intervene in the proceeding to consider the elimination of the Seasonal Rate Class by Hydro One Networks Inc. ("HON"). The Council is a public-interest entity which represents the interests of residential consumers in Ontario. The Board's order in this proceeding will ultimately impact the rates that residential consumers pay for the distribution of electricity.

On March 15, 2020, the Council filed with the Board, pursuant to Rule 22.03 of the Ontario Energy Board's Rules of Practice and Procedure, a document describing the Council, its mandate and objectives, membership, the constituency represented, and the types of activities the Council carries out. In addition, we provided a list of the individuals authorized to represent the Council in OEB proceedings.

The nature and scope of the Council's intended participation in the proceeding will be the following:

- 1. To test and assess HON's report and proposed plan to eliminate the Seasonal Rate Class;
- 2. To consider alternatives for the elimination of the Seasonal rate Class;
- 3. To test and consider the impacts on HON's other rate classes; and
- 4. To participate in the various aspects of the proceeding which may include an interrogatory process, a technical conference, a settlement conference and a hearing.

The Council intends to ask for an order of costs in this proceeding. The Council has participated in many electricity proceedings over a long period of time. Specifically, the Council was an intervenor in the proceeding which led to the elimination of the Seasonal Class and the Motion to Review proceeding. In all of those proceedings the Council has been recognized as being eligible for an award of costs. In the absence of an award of costs the Council would be unable to participate in this proceeding.
