Hello, we've owned our cottage for +37 years and invested into our property BUT also a lot into the local community over the years. Our recent Hydro One quarterly invoice (Nov - Feb) was \$190. We were never at the cottage during that period & this cost covered our electric wall clock, microwave light & Heat Line for our well. Based on the OEB proposal, we will be a LOW DENSITY R2 Class & that same usage will double to \$380 for not even using our cottage! Of the \$190, the DELIVERY CHARGE was \$176.70! Add the significant increase over the entire year and the fact we are seniors with fixed income, this is definitely not a fair increase for anyone. I understand Hydro One has produced efficiency savings over a million \$ this past year which should be the continuous game plan for any business and in this case shared with the public to maintain and/or lower our costs. IF this proposed increase is approved, it will also mean less money (economy) to share with the community and it will definitely become an Election issue from rural and waterfront property owners!
