In February I used 0 (zero) electricity at my seasonal residence. I was charged \$50.25 for Delivery. I can only conclude that a potential increase of 100% will result in me paying \$100.50 monthly for using NO electricity. Seems absurd. In most social contracts the cost (OHIP, taxes, OAS, etc.) is borne equally by all. I understand that I am one of those fortunate enough to enjoy a seasonal residence. However, I already pay property taxes disproportionate to full time residents (for virtually no services) and will now be further burdened by this unfair and arbitrary increase.
