

DECISION ON COST ELIGIBILITY EB-2021-0110

Hydro One Networks Inc.

2023-2027 Joint Distribution and Transmission Rates Application

Stakeholder Conference on Draft Hearing Plan

INTRODUCTION

On <u>July 23, 2021</u>, the OEB announced that it would hold a pre-application stakeholder conference (stakeholder conference) on August 12, 2021 to receive input on OEB staff's draft hearing plan for Hydro One Networks Inc.'s (Hydro One) upcoming 2023-2027 joint distribution and transmission rates application.

Parties interested in participating in the stakeholder conference were asked to indicate their intent by filing a letter with the OEB by August 6, 2021. If Hydro One had any objections to the request for cost eligibility, such objections were to be filed with the OEB by August 9, 2021.

Hydro One did not file any objections with respect to the requests for cost eligibility.

This cost eligibility Decision is being issued by delegated authority under section 6 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998.*

OEB FINDINGS

All parties that filed letters of intent with the OEB will be sent the virtual meeting details for the stakeholder conference in a subsequent communication.

AMPCO, Anwaatin, AOA, CCC, DRC, Energy Probe, LMPA, Pollution Probe, SEC and VECC are eligible to apply for an award of costs under the OEB's <u>Practice Direction on Cost Awards</u>. Costs awards will be limited to a maximum of 30 minutes for preparation and the actual meeting time (for each organization). In addition, parties should be aware that approval for cost eligibility for the stakeholder conference does not imply that intervenor status and cost eligibility will be granted for the actual hearing.

Cost eligible participants should be aware that the OEB will not generally allow the recovery of costs for the attendance of more than one representative of any party, unless a compelling reason is provided when cost claims are filed.

All parties granted cost eligibility shall file their cost claims with the OEB by **August 26**, **2021**. Hydro One shall file with the OEB and forward to parties any objections to claimed costs by **September 2**, **2021**. Parties shall file with the OEB and forward to Hydro One any reply to objections to the costs claims by **September 9**, **2021**. The OEB will issue a cost award decision after this process concludes.
