# NORTH BAY HYDRO DISTRIBUTION LIMITED

Application for rates and other charges to be effective May 1, 2022

## 1 OVERVIEW

The Ontario Energy Board is approving changes to the rates that North Bay Hydro Distribution Limited (North Bay Hydro) charges to distribute electricity to its customers, effective May 1, 2022.

As a result of this Decision, there will be a monthly total bill increase of \$2.23 for a residential customer consuming 750 kWh, effective May 1, 2022. This change does not factor in applicable taxes or the Ontario Electricity Rebate.

### 2 CONTEXT AND PROCESS

North Bay Hydro filed its application on November 24, 2021 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* and in accordance with Chapter 3 of the OEB's *Filing Requirements for Incentive Rate-Setting Applications*. The application was based on the Price Cap Incentive Rate-setting (Price Cap IR) option.

The Price Cap IR option is one of three incentive rate-setting mechanisms (IRM) approved by the OEB.<sup>1</sup> It involves the setting of rates through a cost of service application in the first year and mechanistic price cap adjustments which may be approved through IRM applications in each of the ensuing four adjustment years.

The OEB follows a standardized and streamlined process for hearing IRM applications filed under Price Cap IR. In each adjustment year of a Price Cap IR term, the OEB prepares a Rate Generator Model that includes, as a placeholder, information from the distributor's past proceedings and annual reporting requirements. A distributor will then review, complete, and include the model with its application, and may update the model during the proceeding to make any necessary corrections or to incorporate new rate-setting parameters as they become available.

North Bay Hydro serves approximately 24,000 mostly residential and commercial electricity customers in City of North Bay.

The application was supported by pre-filed written evidence and a completed Rate Generator Model and as required during the proceeding, North Bay Hydro updated and clarified the evidence.

## 3 DECISION OUTLINE

Each of the following issues is addressed in this Decision, together with the OEB's findings.

- Annual Adjustment Mechanism
- Retail Transmission Service Rates
- Group 1 Deferral and Variance Accounts

Instructions for implementing North Bay Hydro's new rates and charges are set out in the final section of this Decision.

This Decision does not address rates and charges approved by the OEB in prior proceedings, such as specific service charges<sup>2</sup> and loss factors, which are out of scope of an IRM proceeding and for which no further approvals are required to continue to include them on the distributor's Tariff of Rates and Charges.

## 4 ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM

North Bay Hydro has applied to change its rates, effective May 1, 2022, based on a mechanistic rate adjustment using the OEB-approved **inflation minus X-factor** formula applicable to IRM applications. The adjustment applies to distribution rates (fixed and variable) uniformly across all customer classes.<sup>3</sup>

The components of the Price Cap IR adjustment formula applicable to North Bay Hydro are set out in the table below. Inserting these components into the formula results in a 3.00% increase to North Bay Hydro's rates: 3.00% = 3.30% - (0.00% + 0.30%).

An inflation factor of 3.30% applies to all IRM applications for the 2022 rate year.

On August 6, 2021, the OEB issued a Notice on its own motion to initiate a proceeding to consider the inflation factor to be used to set rates for electricity transmitters and electricity and natural gas distributors for the year 2022. The OEB issued its Decision and Order on November 2 over a historical study period and applies to all IRM applications for the 2022 rate year. The stretch factor component of the X-factor is distributor specific. The OEB has established five stretch factor groupings, ranging from 0.00% to 0.60%. The stretch factor assigned to any particular distributor is based on the distributor's total cost performance as benchmarked against other distributors in

Ontario. The stretch factor assigned to North Bay Hydro is 0.30%, resulting in a rate adjustment of 3.00%.

### **Findings**

North Bay Hydro's request for a 3.00% rate adjustment is in accordance with the annually updated parameters set by the OEB. The adjustment is approved, and North Bay Hydro's new rates shall be effective May 1, 2022.

## 5 RETAIL TRANSMISSION SERVICE RATES

North Bay Hydro is partially embedded within Hydro One Networks Inc.'s distribution system.

To recover its cost of transmission services, North Bay Hydro requests approval to adjust the retail transmission service rates (RTSRs) that it charges its customers in accordance with the Uniform Transmission Rates (UTRs) and host distributor RTSRs currently in effect.

### **Findings**

North Bay Hydro's proposed adjustment to its RTSRs is approved. The RTSRs were adjusted based on the current OEB-approved UTRs and host-RTSRs.<sup>7</sup>

UTRs and host-RTSRs are typically approved annually by the OEB. In the event that new UTRs or host-RTSRs take effect during North Bay Hydro's 2022 rate year, any resulting differences (from the prior-approved UTRs and host-RTSRs) are to be captured in Retail Settlement Variance Accounts 1584 (Retail Transmission Network Charge) and 1586 (Retail Transmission Connection Charge).

# 6 GROUP 1 DEFERRAL AND VARIANCE ACCOUNTS

In each year of an IRM term, the OEB will review a distributor's Group 1 deferral and variance accounts to determine whether those balances should be disposed. OEB policy states that Group 1 account balances should be disposed if they exceed, on a net basis (as a debit or credit), a pre-set disposition threshold of \$0.001 per kWh, unless a distributor can justify why balances should not be disposed. If the balance does not exceed the threshold, a distributor may still request disposition.

The 2020 year-end net balance for North Bay Hydro's Group 1 accounts that are eligible for disposition, including interest projected to April 30, 2022, is a credit of \$172,751, and pertains to variances accumulated during the 2017 to 2020. This amount represents a total claim of \$0.0004 per kWh, which does not exceed the disposition threshold, and North Bay Hydro has not requested disposition.

North Bay Hydro was last approved to dispose of its Account 1588 and Account 1589 balances on a final basis in its IRM proceeding for 2018 rates. 10 In North Bay Hydro's IRM proceeding for 2019 rates, the OEB noted concerns relating to these accounts. 11 The OEB indicated that it expected North Bay Hydro to apply the OEB's accounting guidance for Accounts 1588 and 1589 to its 2017 transactions. Furthermore, if North Bay Hydro identified material adjustments required to Accounts 1588 or 1589 as a result of utilizing the methodology prescribed in the guidance, the OEB expected North Bay Hydro to identify the differences and explain these adjustments in its IRM application for 2020 rates. In North Bay Hydro's IRM proceeding for 2020 rates, North Bay Hydro noted that due to system limitations, it experienced an unforeseen delay in its implementation of the accounting guidance. In the associated decision and order, the OEB reiterated its expectations for North Bay Hydro to identify and explain any material adjustments resulting from the application of the accounting guidance on its 2017 to 2019 Account 1588 and 1589 balances. 12 Subsequently, in North Bay Hydro's settlement proposal for its cost of service proceeding for 2021 rates, parties agreed to dispose of Group 1 balances as at December 31, 2019, with the exception of Accounts

1588 and 1589.<sup>13</sup> North Bay Hydro stated that it would dispose of Account 1588 and 1589 balances in its 2022 rate rate proceeding.

In the current proceeding, North Bay Hydro noted that the disposition threshold is not met. North Bay Hydro proposed to seek disposition in a future application once the disposition threshold is met, so as to limit the number of overlapping rate riders in the current proceeding. Furthermore, North Bay Hydro stated that it has not completed its review of the unresolved difference in the 2017 GA variance and will attempt to reevaluate the 2017 balance prior to seeking disposition.<sup>14</sup>

### **Findings**

The OEB finds no disposition is required at this time. The OEB notes that the disposition threshold has not been exceeded. Furthermore, North Bay Hydro has indicated that it has not completed its review of the unresolved difference pertaining to the 2017 GA variance. The OEB expects North Bay Hydro to bring forth its Group 1 balances for disposition in its 2023 rate proceeding after addressing the unresolved difference for the 2017 GA variance. As noted by the OEB in its findings from past proceedings, North Bay Hydro is directed to apply the accounting guidance for Accounts 1588 and 1589 to the balances from 2017 onwards and to identify and explain any material adjustments resulting from the application of the accounting guidance in its application for 2023 rates. The OEB will review any adjustments and consider disposition of the Group 1 accounts in that proceeding, irrespective of the threshold calculation, given the number of years since Accounts 1588 and 1589 were last disposed.

### 7 IMPLEMENTATION

This Decision is accompanied by a Rate Generator Model, applicable supporting models, and a Tariff of Rates and Charges (Schedule A). The Rate Generator Model also incorporates the rates set out in Table 7.1.

**Table 7.1: Regulatory Charges**

Each of these rates is a component of the "Regulatory Charge" on a customer's bill, established annually by the OEB through a separate, generic order. The RRRP, WMS and CBR rates were set by the OEB on December 16, 2021.<sup>15</sup>

The Smart Metering Entity Charge is a component of the "Distribution Charge" on a customer's bill, established by the OEB through a separate order. The Smart Metering Entity Charge was set by the OEB on March 1, 2018.<sup>16</sup>

In the *Report of the Board: Review of Electricity Distribution Cost Allocation Policy*,<sup>17</sup> the OEB indicated that it will review the default province-wide microFIT charge annually to ensure it continues to reflect actual costs in accordance with the established methodology. On January 26, 2022, the OEB issued a letter advising electricity distributors that the microFIT charge shall remain at \$4.55 for the duration of the 2022 calendar year.

### RESIDENTIAL SERVICE CLASSIFICATION

This classification applies to an account taking electricity at 750 volts or less where the electricity is used exclusively in a separate metered living accommodation. Customers shall be residing in single-dwelling units that consist of a detached house or one unit of a semi-detached, duplex, triplex or quadruplex house, with a residential zoning. Separately metered dwellings within a town house complex or apartment building also qualify as residential customers. All customers are single-phase. Class B consumers are defined in accordance with O. Reg. 429/04. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

### **APPLICATION**

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Ontario Energy Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Ontario Energy Board, or as specified herein.

Unless specifically noted, this schedule does not contain any charges for the electricity commodity, be it under the Regulated Price Plan, a contract with a retailer or the wholesale market price, as applicable.
