1 OVERVIEW

On March 23, 2021, the OEB issued a <u>letter</u> announcing the consolidation and continuation of two consultations – Utility Remuneration (EB-2018-0287) and Responding to Distributed Energy Resources (EB-2018-0288) – as the Framework for Energy Innovation (FEI) under file number EB-2021-0118.

The letter indicated that cost awards would continue to be available under section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, *1998* (the Act) to eligible participants. Those participants who were found eligible for costs in EB-2018-0287/0288 would maintain their eligibility in FEI and were not required to reapply. The letter also indicated that under FEI, work would be undertaken jointly for both Distributed Resources and Utility Incentives and costs awarded for activities related to this work would be recovered as follows effective March 23, 2021:

- 80% from all rate-regulated licensed electricity distributors
- 20% from all rate-regulated licensed electricity transmitters

On October 14, 2021, the OEB issued a <u>letter</u> addressing costs related to participation at the OEB/IESO Joint Engagement Session. The letter indicated that cost awards will be available to those participants in the Joint Engagement Session who have been determined eligible for costs in the FEI consultation.

The following organizations are eligible for an award of costs in relation to cost eligible activities (collectively the eligible participants):¹

- London Property Management Association (LPMA)
- Ontario Chamber of Commerce (OCC)
- Pollution Probe
- School Energy Coalition (SEC)
- Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition (VECC)

In accordance with the Cost Assessment Model, the OEB will apportion costs amongst the distributors class based on customer numbers.

On February 17, 2022, the OEB issued its Notice of Hearing for Cost Awards in which it set out the activities undertaken between March 23, 2021 and January 31, 2022 and the process for cost claims.

The eligible activities are as follows:

FEI Near-Term Priority Workstreams

• Written comments on concerns with near-term priority workstreams up to a maximum of five hours.

FEI Working Group activities

- Preparation for, attendance at, and reporting on FEI working group meetings (for Eligible Participants and/or their consultants) up to 1.5 times of actual attended meeting time.
- FEIWG Lead: Preparation for, attendance at, and reporting on meetings (for Eligible Participants and/or their consultants) up to 2.5 times of actual attended meeting time.
- Sub-group members: Preparation for, attendance at, and reporting on sub-group meetings (for Eligible Participants and/or their consultants) up to 2.5 times of actual attended meeting time.

Joint OEB/IESO Engagement Session

• Attendance and participation at the OEB/IESO Joint Engagement Session for a maximum of two hours.

The OEB received cost claims from Anwaatin, AMPCO, CME, CCC, EVS, Environmental Defence, IGUA, OCC, Pollution Probe and SEC. BOMA, Energy Probe, LPMA and VECC did not file a cost claim. No objections were received.

Findings

The OEB has reviewed the cost claims filed to ensure they were compliant with the OEB's *Practice Direction on Cost Awards*.

The OEB finds that the claims are reasonable and within the maximum number of hours eligible for cost awards. The OEB approves cost awards for the Eligible Participants as follows:

The OEB also approves an amount of \$69,911.93 for recovery from rate-regulated electricity distributors and rate-regulated electricity transmitters (rate-regulated utilities) associated with the OEB's costs incidental to this consultation.

Process for Paying the Cost Awards

The amount payable by each rate-regulated utility in relation to costs awarded to each eligible participant is listed in Schedule A to this Decision and Order. The amounts will not be paid directly by the rate-regulated utilities to the eligible participants.

The OEB will use the process set out in section 12 of the Practice Direction on Cost Awards to implement the payment of the approved cost awards whereby the OEB will act as a clearing house for all payments of cost awards. Consistent with this process, each rate-regulated utility is issued one invoice that covers all cost awards payable for the relevant period. As a result, the invoice may cover cost awards payable in relation to several proceedings and consultations, including this proceeding.

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD ORDERS THAT:

1. Each rate-regulated utility in Schedule A to this Decision and Order shall make a payment to the OEB in accordance with the invoice set out in Schedule A. The payment shall be due at the same time as all other cost assessments under section 26 of the OEB Act.
