# Community energy managers, internships and co-op students

Our Sustainable Communities program provides expertise, education, and funding to help eligible local governments improve sustainability in their communities.

We help local governments by providing funding to hire sustainable energy professionals. This support is designed to help you progress towards building a more energy efficient, resilient and sustainable community.

These opportunities include:

- · Community energy managers
- Co-op students and interns
- UBC sustainability scholars

# Community energy manager

We're offering funding to help you hire a community energy manager for your local government. We'll provide up to 50% of the salary of a full-time senior staff member (to a maximum of \$50,000 per year) for two years (funding reviewed and renewed annually).

#### What they do

An energy manager can help lead and implement energy and emissions planning and energy projects including:

- Drive development and implementation of community energy and emissions plans.
- Lead policy development and implementation to advance energy conservation and efficiency.
- · Act as a champion and project manager for key energy efficiency initiatives.
- Raise awareness about our energy efficiency programs and incentives available to residents and businesses in your community.

#### **Eligibility requirements**

Your local government or regional district is within BC Hydro's service area and meets one of the following criteria:

- Population over 75,000
- Champion community population over 20,000 with a council-approved CEEP (or equivalent) and demonstrated leadership in electricity demand-side management

# Interns and co-op students

Eligible local governments can receive a salary subsidy to fill student community to support energy-efficiency and sustainability projects in their community. We'll provide up to 50% of the salary costs associated with hiring an intern or co-op student to a maximum of \$7,000 per 4-month term.



# **UBC Sustainability Scholars**

The UBC Sustainability Scholars program is an innovative paid internship program that matches graduate-level students with local governments and partner organizations to provide research support and help advance the organization's sustainability projects. UBC Sustainability Scholars are an excellent resource, and we provide funding to help you retain a scholar to move your climate action projects forward. The UBC Sustainability Scholars program runs from May to August of each year with an annual call for projects taking place each fall/winter.
