Hydro One Networks Inc

Application for an Accounting Order to establish a subaccount of the Capital Contribution Recovery Differential Account

PROCEDURAL ORDER NO. 2 April 20, 2022

Hydro One Networks Inc (Hydro One) filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) on February 24, 2022, under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, for an Accounting Order to establish a sub-account pertaining to the deferral of capital contributions payable to Hydro One by Toronto Hydro-Electric System Limited.

A Notice of Hearing and Procedural Order No. 1 was issued on March 24, 2022. School Energy Coalition (SEC) and Power Workers' Union (PWU) applied for intervenor status. SEC also applied for cost eligibility.

Through a letter dated April 11, 2022, the OEB granted SEC and PWU intervenor status, and granted SEC cost eligibility.

On April 13, 2022, Hydro One issued a letter advising of withdrawal of its application. The OEB acknowledges Hydro One's correspondence. OEB File No. EB-2022-0101 will be closed.

The OEB is making the following procedural provisions for costs related to this proceeding.

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD ORDERS THAT:

- 1. SEC shall file with the OEB and forward to Hydro One its cost claim in accordance with the OEB's *Practice Direction on Cost Awards* on or before **April** 27, 2022.
- 2. Hydro One shall file with the OEB and forward to intervenors any objections to the claimed costs of SEC on or before **May 4, 2022**.
- 3. If Hydro One objects to any SEC costs, SEC shall file with the OEB and forward to Hydro One its response, if any, to the objection to cost claims on or before **May 11, 2022**.

4. Hydro One shall pay the OEB's costs of, and incidental to, this proceeding upon receipt of the OEB's invoice.

Parties are responsible for ensuring that any documents they file with the OEB, such as applicant and intervenor evidence, interrogatories and responses to interrogatories or any other type of document, **do not include personal information** (as that phrase is defined in the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*), unless filed in accordance with rule 9A of the OEB's Rules of Practice and Procedure.
