# Board File No. EB-2007-0776 Newmarket-Tay Power Distribution Ltd. – 2008 Rates Rebasing Application Intervention of Energy Probe

Pursuant to the Notice of Application, issued by the Board on July 21, 2008, Energy Probe Research Foundation (Energy Probe) is hereby providing Notice of Intervention in the EB-2007-0776 proceeding for the Board's consideration. An electronic version of this communication will be forwarded in PDF format.

Energy Probe has become aware of a number of issues it may wish to pursue in this Matter, and has therefore availed itself of expert support. Energy Board has not fully reviewed the Applicant's evidence and has not as yet determined if an oral hearing is appropriate.

It is the position of Energy Probe that it would be appropriate for the Board to consider utilizing the lessons learned in the 2008 applications which were filed in a more timely manner and were the subject of the Board's July 17, 2008 webcast and background material titled *Your 2009 Cost of Service Rate Application: The Hearing Process and the Filing Guidelines*.

During the interrogatory process in a number of 2008 cost of service applications, it seemed that responses to intervenor and Board staff interrogatories appeared to raise as many questions as were answered. As the Applicant has not previously appeared before the Board in a cost of service proceeding, Energy Probe submits that both an interrogatory process and a Technical Conference should be scheduled, followed by an ADR. At the conclusion of the ADR, the Board could decide whether all outstanding issues might be addressed through a Written Hearing or if a limited number of issues required a short Oral Hearing, as in the case of EB-2007-0697, the Horizon Utilities Corporation proceeding.
