

We will also hear questions and arguments from individual consumers, municipalities and others whose interests would be affected. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide whether to approve the application.

The OEB’s legislative authority with respect to the applications seeking approval for the construction of hydrocarbon pipelines (usually natural gas pipelines) is set out in Sections 90(1), 91 and 96(1) of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* (OEB Act). Under section 97 of the OEB Act, the OEB has authority over the form of agreements that have been or will be offered to landowners affected by the project.

When determining whether a project is in the public interest, the OEB typically examines the need for the project, project alternatives, project cost and economics, environmental impacts, land matters, and Indigenous consultation.

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

We write on behalf of the applicant, SCPL, regarding the meeting on March 29, 2022 where Haudenosaunee Development Institute ("HDI") asked SCPL to answer five follow up questions. On April 6, 2022, HDI's counsel provided a draft Engagement Agreement for SCPL's consideration. We provide a response to each of these below.

1. Whether SCPL would consent to an extension of the deadline for item #3 in Procedural Order No 1 dated March 22, 2022 from April 1, 2022 to April 8, 2022

SCPL consented to this extension on March 31, 2022 and we understand this issue has been fully resolved.

2. Please provide the authorization letter from Fisheries and Oceans Canada ("DFO")

Please see attached as Schedule A for a copy of the correspondence from the DFO on January 17, 2022 regarding a request to review the project.

3. Please provide SCPL's position on Indigenous ownership of pipelines – specific to the section of pipeline subject of the Application

SCPL does not take a position on Indigenous ownership of pipelines for the purposes of the Application. The Application only involves the replacement of 480m of an existing 12-inch pipeline and SCPL is not seeking investment at this time for this segment of pipeline.

4. Please provide SCPL's easement payment formula

The OEB does not have authority or jurisdiction to determine the amount of compensation payable for easements. As set out in section 100 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, compensation is determined by the Ontario Land Tribunal under the *Expropriations Act*. Therefore, this issue is not relevant or material to the Application.

SCPL also views the information requested as commercially sensitive and confidential. SCPL does not share this information with any third parties except as required by applicable law.

5. Please provide a list of future activities, including dates, for pipeline maintenance and construction

The new pipe segment that SCPL proposes to install in the Application will ensure safe and reliable long-term operation of the pipeline system as well as compliance with Technical Standards and Safety Authority regulations and the Canadian Standards Association Z662 standard. SCPL does not anticipate any future activities for pipeline maintenance and construction in relation to the new segment of pipeline aside from routine operations, such as cathodic protection and in-line inspection.

6. Form of Engagement Agreement Proposed by HDI on April 6, 2022

We have reviewed the form of Engagement Agreement proposed by HDI and are of the view that it is not necessary given the limited scope of the project and short timeframe of construction (three to four months). SCPL is of the view that it can provide the same employment opportunities contemplated in the Engagement Agreement to Haudenosaunee individuals and/or businesses under existing Archaeological and Environmental Monitoring Agreements.

The Fish and Fish Habitat Protection Program (the Program) of Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) received your proposal on December 9, 2021. We understand that you propose to:

- Replace 480m of the existing NPS 12 pipeline in the vicinity of Sixteen Mile Creek; and
- Install the pipeline using Horizontal Directional Drill (HDD).

We understand the following aquatic species listed under the Species at Risk Act may use the area in the vicinity of where your proposal is to be located:

- Silver Shiner listed as THREATENED

Our review considered the following information:

- Request for Review form and associated documents.

Your proposal has been reviewed to determine whether it is likely to result in:

- the death of fish by means other than fishing and the harmful alteration, disruption or destruction of fish habitat which are prohibited under subsections 34.4(1) and 35(1) of the *Fisheries Act*; and
- effects to listed aquatic species at risk, any part of their critical habitat or the residences of their individuals in a manner which is prohibited under sections 32, 33 and subsection 58(1) of the *Species at Risk Act*.

The aforementioned impacts are prohibited unless authorized under their respective legislation and regulations.

Provided that the plans are implemented in the manner, and during the timeframe described, the Program is of the view that your proposal will not require an authorization under the *Fisheries Act* or the *Species at Risk Act*. Additional information on measures to protect fish and fish habitat can be found in the attached document.



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Measures to Protect Fish and Fish Habitat for Horizontal (High Pressure) Directional Drilling:

1. Use existing trails, roads or cut lines wherever possible, as access routes to avoid disturbance to the riparian vegetation.
2. Design the drill path to an appropriate depth below the watercourse to minimize the risk of frac-out and to a depth to prevent the line from becoming exposed due to natural scouring of the stream bed. The drill entry and exit points are far enough from the banks of the watercourse to have minimal impact on these areas.
3. The removal of select plants may be necessary to access the construction site. This removal should be kept to a minimum and within the road or utility right-of-way.
4. Machinery fording the watercourse to bring equipment required for construction to the opposite side is limited to a one-time event (over and back) and should occur only if an existing crossing at another location is not available or practical to use. A Temporary Stream Crossing Code of Practice is available at <https://www.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/pnw-ppe/codes/temporary-crossings-traversees-temporaires-eng.html>.
 - 4.1. If minor rutting is likely to occur, stream bank and bed protection methods (e.g., swamp mats, pads) should be used provided they do not constrict flows or block fish passage.
 - 4.2. Grading of the stream banks for the approaches should not occur.
 - 4.3. If the stream bed and banks are steep and highly erodible (e.g., dominated by organic materials and silts) and erosion and degradation are likely to occur as a result of equipment fording, then a temporary crossing structure or other practice should be used to protect these areas.
 - 4.4. Time the one-time fording to prevent disruption to sensitive fish life stages by adhering to appropriate fisheries timing windows. Timing windows can be found at <https://www.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/pnw-ppe/timing-periodes/index-eng.html>.
 - 4.5. Fording should occur under low flow conditions and not when flows are elevated due to local rain events or seasonal flooding.
5. Operate machinery on land above the ordinary high water mark and in a manner that minimizes disturbance to the banks of the watercourse.
 - 5.1. Machinery is to arrive on site in a clean condition and is to be maintained free of fluid leaks.
 - 5.2. Wash, refuel and service machinery and store fuel and other materials for the machinery away from the water to prevent any deleterious substance from entering the water.
 - 5.3. Keep an emergency spill kit on site in case of fluid leaks or spills from machinery.
 - 5.4. Restore banks to original condition if any disturbance occurs.
6. Construct a dugout/settling basin at the drilling exit site to contain drilling mud to prevent sediment and other deleterious substances from entering the watercourse. If this cannot be achieved, use silt fences or other effective sediment and erosion control measures to prevent drilling mud from entering the watercourse. Inspect these measures regularly during the course of construction and make all necessary repairs if any damage occurs.
 - 6.1. Dispose of excess drilling mud, cuttings and other waste materials at an adequately sized disposal facility located away from the water to prevent it from entering the watercourse.
7. Monitor the watercourse to observe signs of surface migration (frac-out) of drilling mud during all phases of construction.

Emergency Frac-out Response and Contingency Planning:

8. Keep all material and equipment needed to contain and clean up drilling mud releases on site and readily accessible in the event of a frac-out.
9. Implement the frac-out response plan that includes measures to stop work, contain the drilling mud and prevent its further migration into the watercourse and notify all applicable authorities, including DFO at FisheriesProtection@dfo-mpo.gc.ca. Prioritize clean up activities relative to the risk of potential harm and dispose of the drilling mud in a manner that prevents re-entry into the watercourse.
10. Ensure clean up measures do not result in greater damage to the banks and watercourse than from leaving the drilling mud in place.
11. Implement the contingency crossing plan including measures to either re-drill at a more appropriate location or to isolate the watercourse to complete the crossing at the current location.
12. Stabilize any waste materials removed from the work site to prevent them from entering the watercourse. This could include covering spoil piles with biodegradable mats or tarps or planting them with preferably native grass or shrubs.
13. Vegetate any disturbed areas by planting and seeding preferably with native trees, shrubs or grasses and cover such areas with mulch to prevent erosion and to help seeds germinate. If there is insufficient time remaining in the growing season, the site should be stabilized (e.g., cover exposed areas with erosion control blankets to keep the soil in place and prevent erosion) and vegetated the following spring.
 - 13.1. Maintain effective sediment and erosion control measures until re-vegetation of disturbed areas is achieved.



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

Dear Mr. Beaudoin,

Further to your email addressed to the Huron-Wendat Nation dated December 8, 2020, on the Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment for the proposed Park Lawn GO Station, the Huron-Wendat Nation (HWN) would like to thank you for giving us this opportunity to provide comments and feedback.

The project consists in the replacement of the NPS12 pipeline with new deeper pipe in the vicinity of its crossing with East Sixteen Mile Creek. The report indicates that “The project area is roughly 1.507 ha in size and falls within Lot 4, Concessions 7 and 8 New Survey, Geographic Township of Trafalgar (North), now Regional Municipality of Halton, Ontario. The project area consists of the Drill Entry and Drill Exit Areas point on either side of Trafalgar Road, a linear Pipe Laydown Area west of Trafalgar Road, and the Drill Path beneath Trafalgar Road, East Sixteen Mile Creek and its unnamed tributary”

A description of the environmental context of the project is included.

Regarding the archaeological context, 20 registered archaeological sites exist within a one-km radius of the Project area. The report provides a brief overview of these sites: “Of the 20 registered sites, four are 19th-century settler homesteads, one is a Late Archaic period Indigenous findspot, one is Late Archaic period Indigenous artifact scatter, one is a Middle Archaic period Indigenous findspot, one is a Late Archaic and Early Woodland period Indigenous artifact scatter, and the remaining 12 are Indigenous findspots or artifact scatters which cannot be dated. A total of five sites are located within 300 m of the Project area: AjGw-60, AjGw-264, AjGw-320, AjGw-321 and AjGw-322. The nearest of these sites is AjGw-264, which is a 19th-century homestead located approximately 125 m south of the Drill Entry Area. This site has been fully mitigated and its former location falls within what is now a large artificial pond.” The four archaeological investigations that were found to have been completed for lands within 50 m of the project area are also discussed.

The report describes adequately the Indigenous settlement in Milton. The 19th century and municipal settlement is also discussed, and a review was made of historic maps (1860 Tremaine's Map, 1877 Illustrated Historical Atlas Map) and aerial photographs (1954, 2010, 2015) to better understand the recent evolution of the study area. A property inspection was also conducted, which permitted the precise description of the current state of the study area, complemented by multiple photographs (Images 1-10 of the report).

The report indicates that the study area meets multiple criteria that indicate archaeological potential: presence of water sources (East Sixteen Mile Creek and a tributary of the East Branch of Sixteen Mile Creek), 19th century structures as observed on maps (two farmsteads), and proximity to previously registered archaeological sites (AjGw-60, AjGw-264, AjGw-320, AjGw-321 and AjGw-322).

The Trafalgar Road ROW and the zone to the east of Trafalgar Road (15.1% of the study area) were previously assessed and no further work was recommended. Additionally, approximately 27.6% of the project area was identified as obviously disturbed, 1.0% was steeply sloped, and 0.8% was low-lying and wet. These zones are of low potential, and no further work is recommended. The remaining 55.5% of the project area consists in "areas of woodlot, the planted tree farm area and the ravine within the Pipe Laydown Area, the Drill Exit Area and the Drill Path", and these areas have archaeological potential and will require a Stage 2 AA.

In conclusion, the report describes clearly the environmental, archaeological, and historical context of the region, and notes the various indicators of archaeological potential present. The report follows the Standards and Guidelines, and the conclusions are logical. Regarding future archaeological work, the Huron-Wendat Nation is requesting to be consulted at every stage and of course provide monitors for any field work. Please do not hesitate to contact our team should you have questions and to follow up with the next steps.



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

Attachment 1: East Sixteen Mile Crossing Replacement Project

Project Summary

Sun-Canadian Pipe Line (SCPL) has identified the need to replace approximately 500m segment of an existing 12 inch diameter pipeline (TRL system) near Trafalgar Road and south of Britannia Road in the Town of Milton. The existing pipeline segment crosses under East Sixteen Mile creek and has become exposed in several locations in the watercourse due to ongoing erosion and creek meander. This project intends to install a new segment of 12 inch diameter pipe via horizontal directional drilling at a greater depth to eliminate the environmental risks of the current pipe exposure.

Project Information

SCPL's TRL system supplies finished petroleum products including gasoline, jet fuel, and diesel fuels to terminals in Southern Ontario. The TRL system originates in Sarnia and has connections to distribution terminals in London, Pearson Airport, and Toronto. This system is critical to ensuring adequate supply of fuels products throughout the Greater Toronto Area.

The current segment of the TRL system that requires replacement is located in the Town of Milton. Drill entry is located on Piper's Heath golf course in Town of Milton. Drill exit is located on PAO Tree Nursery in Town of Milton. See Figure 1 below for existing and proposed pipeline routing as well as coordinates of the two temporary work locations. The drill entry and drill exit sites are both located on previously disturbed lands. Both sites will be accessed by existing roads. Temporary matting will be used at both work locations to minimize disturbance.

Indigenous Engagement

Earlier this month, we reached out to the Mississauga of the Credit and Six Nations of the Grand River by phone and by email to briefly introduce the project. While most administrations remain temporarily closed for the COVID-19 outbreak, we did receive a positive acknowledgement from the Mississauga of the Credit First Nation to participate in project discussions of the project in the near future.

Authorizations and Recommendations Required

This project is being planned in accordance with OEB regulations and will request a "Leave to Construct" under subsection 90 from the OEB. An environmental assessment will be completed as part of that process. Engagement with landowners, Indigenous communities, Conservation Halton, and the municipality will also be enacted. Other authorization, notification, permits, and/or approvals may be required and identified as part of this process.

Project Activities

Design of the new pipe segment will be done to ensure safe and reliable long-term operation of the pipeline system as well as compliance with Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) regulations and Canadian Standards Association (CSA) Z662 standard. Design of the horizontal directional drill plan

will be done to prevent drill fluid losses and ensure proper control of the drill path. Major phases of this project include engineering design, environmental assessment, landowner/Indigenous engagement, approvals, contractor selection, and construction/decommissioning.

Public consultation will be undertaken as part of the Leave to Construct process. Landowners impacted by this proposed work will be engaged and access agreements and/or easement agreements will be put in place. Identified landowners and tenants impacted by this work include:

- York Trafalgar Golf Corp



- Terra Greenhouses
- PAO Nursery

Construction will require temporary work sites at the drill entry and exit points. Both work sites have existing road access. Brush clearing and temporary matting will be needed to ensure a safe work space. The new pipe segment will be assembled, hydrotested, and installed from the drill exit location. The TRL pipeline system will then be shut down and drained, and the new pipe segment will be tied in at the drill entry and exit locations. The existing pipe removed from service will be cleaned, capped, and filled with grout. All work locations will then be backfilled and returned to their original condition.

Potential Environmental Effects and Mitigation Measures

The Environmental Assessment will assess physical, natural and socio-economical features potentially impacted by construction activities (such as minor brushing and ground disturbance at the drill entry and exit). Mitigation measures will be recommended as part of the screening to minimize potential adverse effects to the environment. The mitigation recommendations, together with SCPL project management processes, should effectively serve to protect environmental features within the proposed work locations.

It is anticipated that the majority of adverse and/or socio-economic effects will be construction-related temporary and transitory, and likely avoided by locating the drill sites outside of the creek valley and on previously disturbed areas.

Project Benefits



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

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

Hello Susan, John, Colm,

It was nice meeting and chatting with you today about SCPL's East 16-Mile Creek Pipeline Replacement Project near Milton, Ontario. As discussed, as part of Energy's routine follow up with consultation list communities, we recently met with a representative at Six Nations of the Grand River First Nation (SNGRFN) to hear their perspectives about both the project and SCPL's approach to consultation to date.

As we shared today, SNGRFN raised several concerns about SCPL's approach to consultation during our March 24th meeting (as well as other concerns that are beyond the scope of the East 16-Mile Creek project). The primary concerns raised by SNGRFN related to the project included:

- concerns relating to the environmental impacts of the project and opportunities for environmental monitors; and
- lack of any subsequent opportunity to meet or detailed follow-up, after the initial meeting between SCPL and the community held on September 22, 2020.

As we noted today, while we understand that several SNGRFN representatives participated in the September 2020 meeting with SCPL, our March 24 meeting was only with one individual from the community's consultation office. It is also evident from our review of the available consultation records that SNGRFN did not contact SCPL to request or arrange any follow up meetings.

Regardless, based on the current concerns raised by SNGRFN on our March 24th call, we recommend and encourage SCPL to work with the SNGRFN to arrange another meeting(s) to hear and discuss their additional or outstanding concerns relating to the project. This could also support a more meaningful relationship with the community's consultation office. If desired, Ministry of Energy staff are available to observe any future meetings, provided there is agreement between SNGRFN and SCPL about the participation of IEP staff. Any meetings should be arranged as soon as possible, relative to the Ontario Energy Board's (OEB) timelines and the community's needs.

We kindly ask that any amendments to the Environmental and/or Indigenous Consultation Reports that are shared with the OEB also be shared with Gillian and I. Alternately, if you let us know via email when amendments are shared with the OEB, we can download them from OEB's repository.

In the interim, please let me know if you have any questions, and we look forward to hearing about the outcomes of any further meetings with SNGRFN or other communities on the consultation list.
