Energy Probe Research Foundation (Energy Probe) hereby applies for intervenor status and cost eligibility in the EB-2022-0137 proceeding, the application by the Independent Electricity System Operator / Smart Metering Entity for approval of its proposed 2023-2027 Smart Metering Charge Application.

## **Statement of Interest**

Energy Probe is a non-profit environmental and consumer organization which promotes economic efficiency in the use of resources. It will be representing its many individual residential customer supporters. Energy Probe argues for equitable rates that optimize results for all ratepayers by eliminating cross subsidies between ratepayer classes and between generations of ratepayers. If the proposed Smart Metering Charge is approved residential customer supporters of Energy Probe will ultimately be required to pay for it in electricity distribution rates. Also, Energy Probe was an intervenor in the recent EB-2021-0292 proceeding which dealt with SME application to expand third party access and was party to the Settlement Proposal that was approved by the OEB in its EB-2021-0292 Decision issued March 24, 2022. At page 9 of the Settlement Proposal the parties agreed that *information with respect to actual cost* of the \$145 per hour third party

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access charge *will be made available in a future SME application*, which is this application. Energy Probe, therefore, has a direct interest in this proceeding.

# Hearing

Energy Probe hopes that all issues can be resolved by settlement. If a hearing is necessary, it should be in written form.

## Costs

Energy Probe is a non-profit organization which relies on individual donations to help protect the public interest. Without the prospect of an award of costs, Energy Probe's ability to participate in proceedings would be very limited. Energy Probe intends to seek a cost award in this proceeding, in accordance with the Board's guidelines regarding cost awards.
