Application for an Electricity Generation Licence

DECISION AND ORDER

Twin Falls Limited Partnership (Twin Falls) filed a complete application with the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) on September 15, 2022, under section 60 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, 1998 (OEB Act) for an electricity generation licence renewal.

This Decision and Order is being issued by the Delegated Authority, pursuant to Section 6 of the OEB Act. The Delegated Authority has considered the application without holding a hearing pursuant to section 6(4) of the OEB Act.

Kagiano Power Corporation is the general partner of the Twin Falls Limited Partnership, and is wholly owned by Biigtigong Nishnaabeg (formerly Ojibway of the Pic River First Nation). The Limited Partners of the Twin Falls Limited Partnership are Biigtigong Nishnaabeg and the Anishinabek Nation Management Group Inc. Twin Falls was established to sell power produced at the Twin Falls Generating Station to Ontario.

The applicant has been previously licensed by the OEB and applied to renew its electricity generation licence on April 22, 2022, which was set to expire on May 16, 2022. An Interim Decision and Order extending the licence term to October 1, 2022, was issued on May 5, 2022. The applicant is currently licensed to own and operate one electricity generation facility in Ontario, namely:

1. 4.9 MW Twin Falls Generating Station located in Zone 16 E565500 N548700, Ontario.

After considering the application and assessing the technical capability and financial viability of the applicant, the OEB finds that it is in the public interest to grant the application and issue the electricity generation licence to Twin Falls Limited Partnership. The OEB notes the application was filed by the applicant only 24 days prior to the expiration of the existing licence and takes this opportunity to remind the applicant and all existing licencees that they must ensure their renewal application is filed in time to permit the OEB to undertake its review and issue a licence prior to the expiry of an existing licence.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The application is granted, on such conditions as are contained in the attached licence.
