OGVG would like clarification with respect to whether both phases of the project provide increased capacity to the entire "area of benefit" or whether each project, on a stand-alone basis, provides increased capacity to a distinct subset of the "area of benefit". Additionally, OGVG would like clarification as to the stand alone incremental capacity of each project as compared to the combined incremental capacity provided when both projects are in service (for example, at Exhibit I.Staff.5 b) ii) EGI notes that the Leamington Interconnect reduces to 44 TJ/day when implemented on a stand-alone basis).

OGVG would like clarification as to the relationship between EGI's Stage 3 Economic Analysis, the "direct" economic benefits of the project included in that analysis, and the incremental \$6.37 billion in capital investment and 11,526 jobs associated with the expansion of business operations within the "area of benefit".

OGVG would like clarification as to whether this response is indicating that EGI's current assessment of the need for distribution related facilities to connect customers to the new load provided by the Project does not include new facilities large enough to require leave to construct and only includes one project material enough to consider the use of the hourly allocation factor.
